

WAGE IS PAID

Laundryworkers Do Not Fare as Well as Store Employees.

STATISTICS ARE COMPILED

Washington Welfare Commission Finds Women in Larger Cities Fare Better Than Elsewhere, but Tacoma Is Exception.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Nov. 15.—(Special.)—A second branch of the investigation of women's wages, just concluded by the Washington Industrial Welfare Commission, indicates that the wages of laundry employees range much lower than those of girls and women employed in stores.

Only 44 per cent of the employees of mercantile establishments investigated earned less than \$9 a week, but the laundry investigation, covering the wages received by 239 employees in all parts of the state, shows that 51 per cent are earning less than \$9.

This difference is due partly to the fact that while in practically all of the employees of a mercantile establishment work a full week of 48 hours, only 40 per cent of the laundry employees work a full 48 hours, though four-fifths do more than five days' work. About five and one-half days is the average week of a laundry girl.

Tacoma Wages Low.

The larger the city, the greater the number of hours during which a laundry is operated and the larger the wages received by the employees. The investigation shows, thus in Seattle, where 90 per cent of the employees work more than five days, 55 per cent receive weekly wages of \$9 or more, while in Everett, where only 53 per cent of the workers labor over five days, only 15 per cent earn as much as \$9.
