

## STACKING HAY NEAR KLAMATH FALLS.

NE of the typical features of the newer agriculture in Oregon is the production of alfalfa, and it is in the great counties of Southern Central Oregon and Eastern Oregon that this industry has been developed most extensively. Klamath County ranks among the six leading alfalfa-producing counties in the state. The great extent of the farms and the enormous crop production have made necessary the development of "wholesale" methods of handling the crop, which are peculiar to country where the farmer's cottage is often "forty miles from his front gale."
