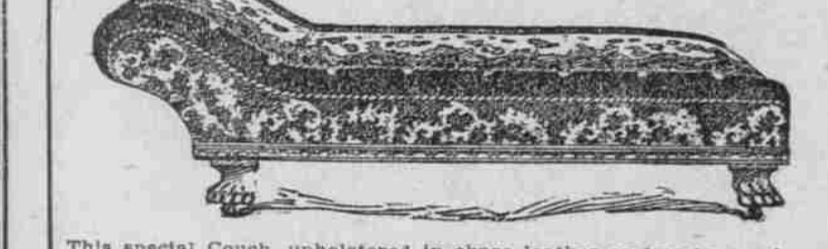

Extra pitchers are Lund, Leeper, Washington, Larkin, Schroeder and Jones. The first few days will determine which will stick as the pitching staff must be cut to four within two weeks.

The Walla Walla Bears' only weak point is in the pitching staff, Bridger being the only old head in the bunch. Manager Wade hopes to develop one or two good men.

The infield is believed to be stronger than last year, even with Bobby Davis out. Schmidt, in training, looks like a second Davis. Sheely's ankle is all right and he is looked on as 25 per cent better than last year.
