WESTERN Oregon, and particularly the Willamette Valley, seems to be the natural home of the holly. All varieties are seen in Portland yards, and small groves are sometimes planted for the revenue that their berry-clustered foliage will bring at holiday time. Both leaves and berries are brilliant in coloring, and what with the mistletoe that grows on the Oregon oaks, there is no lack of greenery for Christmas decorations. Holly may be grown either from cuttings or from planting the berries, and this picture is evidence of the luxuriance which it may attain in Portland.
