TACOMA, Wash., April 18 .-- (Special.) -Walter M. Harvey, well-known Ta-coma attorney, took the witness stand today in the Superior Court in the Barnhisel divorce case and passed the lie direct and plain to Rev. A. H. Barnhisel, who had declared on the stand that he had seen Mrs. Harvey smoke cigarettes at a large dinner at the Tacoma Country Club and had seen women gambling for money there. Mr. Harvey declared Mrs. Harvey had never smoked or gambled, and would have been present to deny the charges herself if the statement made by Rev. Mr. Barnhisel in the divorce action had not prostrated her so that she was too ill to appear.
"If Mr. Barnhisel said Mrs. Harvey

smoked cigarettes or gambled either in her own home, at the Country Club, or in any other place, he deliberately lied," sald Harvey, answering a question of Mrs. Barnishel's attorney.

"Mrs. Harvey has never smoked or gambled on any occasion that I know of in the 16 years of our married life."



He said the pamphlets for Marion, Lane and Clackamas Counties had been printed and would be mailed Monday: The pamphlets for Multno-mah County will be printed early in the week and mailed upon receipt by the Secretary of State from the State

The law requires that the State Printer shall deliver the pamphlets to the Secretary of State between April 22 and April 28, and all but a compara-tively small number will have been mailed to registered voters before May 1, when registration for the pri-mary will close.
