OREGON WINS MEET; ONE RECORD BROKEN

University Takes Track and Field Event From Multnomah Club, 71 to 60.

M'CLURE DOES MILE 4:20

Ruse Worked on Winged "M" Entry Turns Tide in Favor of Collegians. Mile Run Is Feature of Day on Sensational Finish.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Or., April 25.—(Special.)—In the fastest and closest meet ever held between the collegians and clubmen, the University of Oregon today defeated Multnomah Athletic clubmen on the track and field by a score of 71 to 60. One University record was bettered when Walter McClure, a university student running under the club colors, paced a mile in 4:20 flat, shattering the record by 41 seconds in the California-Stanford meet of two weeks ago by one-fifth of a second.

In actual competition Oregon earned only six points more than the winged "M" the last event on the programme, the relay, being conceded to collegians, and, therefore, contributing an extra five points to their score. Through-out three-fourths of the meet the collegians retained the lead, at one time having a margin of 13 points.

Collegians Work Ruse.

It was a ruse worked on Walter McClure by Nelson and McConnell in the half-mile which helped turn the tide in favor of Hayward's team in this race. Instead of allowing McClure to lay back and win on his great spurting powers, as is his habit, the Oregon pair lay back and forced him to keep the lead. The result was that the race until the final 200 yards was comparatively slow, as is shown by the time of 2:09 4-5. Suddenly, while McClure was leading along with the race apparently won, Nelson and McConnell put on again and opened up 20 yards of daylight between themselves and the Olympic runner. Before McClure could recover his two rivals had breasted the tape.

The first event, the mile, was easily the feature of the day. McClure's finish was remarkable. He ate up 30 yards of space between himself and Payne, of Oregon, in the stretch.

The two met only inches apart at the finish, so that Payne made practically as fast time as McClure. The latter, although still eligible for any meet in which a conference college is not a party, was allowed to reappear in Multnomah by Hayward to give Payne keener competition. Payne set a heart-breaking pace, averaging the mile in 4:29.8, but McClure's superior performance was that of Loucks, who never slipped into a pair of spiked shoes before.

McClure's record was the best of the quarter in 59-2-3 seconds, within one-fifth of a second of Windable's college record.

Multnomah's Multnomah, was highest individual point winner, taking both hurdle events with yards to spare and tying for second in the high jump for a total of 12 points. For the relay, the shot put and discus throw, but did not place in the high jump. The javelin throw proved that Hayward has two likely successors to Noel Telford, Cook, both of whom beat 166 feet.
