SUFFRAGE BREACH **NEARLY HEALED**

National Leader Leaves City Before Conciliatory Message Is Prepared.

CHICAGO PARADE BIG ONE

Thousands of Women, Many Past 70. Participate in Demonstrations Designed in Part as Means of Thanking Lawmakers.

CHICAGO, May 2 .- Suffrage day was celebrated today by the largest parade of women ever held in Chicago. Thousands of women, several of them past 70, many of them not yet 21, marched

70, many of them not yet 21, marched down Michigan avenue in 10 divisions.

Formally, the parade was a means of thanking the State Legislature for voting suffrage to women and as Chicago's part in a National demonstration.

The absence of Miss Jane Addams, acting president of the American National Suffrage Association, and Mrs. Joseph T. Bowen, another of the National officers, marred the harmony of the demonstration. A rupture between the National lenders and the state forces, led by Mrs. Grace Wilbur Trout, was nearly healed earlier in the day, when a message was prepared at suffrage headquarters similar to the resolution which the National Association had asked the state organization to approve.


