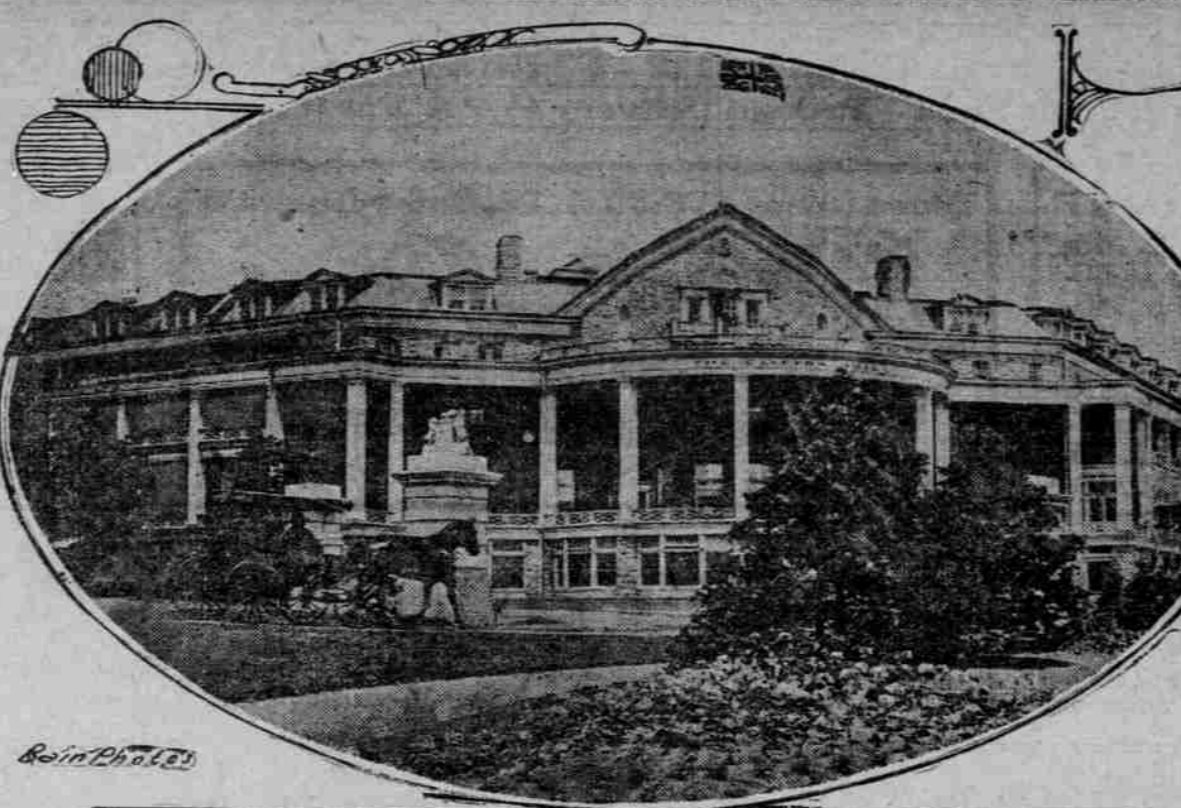

'SLAVER'S' PLEA HEARD

DEPORTATION DELAYED TO PREVENT POSSIBLE EXECUTION. Son of Rebel General Who Violated Immigration Laws Feels Death at Hands of Federals.

SAN DIEGO, May 16.—Declaring that if the orders for his deportation were given and the immigration authorities forced him across the line he would be executed by the federal soldiers at Tia Juana, Frederico Torres, said to be the son of a rebel general operating with General Carranza...

Torres was being taken to the boundary line today for deportation when he protested to Immigration Inspector Weddle. Although doubting the Mexican's story, Weddle was loath to let the alien go to his death without giving him the benefit of the doubt and investigating. Accordingly he telegraphed to Washington, asking permission to hold the deportation warrant in abeyance pending further investigation.
