

NATION TO HONOR LATE MRS. WILSON

Whole Country to Show Respect to Dead in Historic East Room.

EACH STATE REPRESENTED

Services Tomorrow in White House Will Consist of Simple Presbyterian Rites, at Which Most Intimate Will Be Present.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—The Nation, represented in Washington by Congress and the Government departments, will pay tribute Monday afternoon to Mrs. Woodrow Wilson, wife of the President, whose funeral is to be held at 2 o'clock that afternoon in the historic East Room of the White House. Word has come from many parts of the country indicating people quite generally will show their respect in various ways while the services are being held.

The Senate adjourned tonight until Tuesday out of respect for the memory of Mrs. Wilson and the House took similar action today. All Government departments in Washington will be closed Monday and Tuesday afternoons during the services here and at Rome, Ga.

The special funeral committee of the Senate, headed by Vice-President Marshall, Senator Kern, the Democratic leader, and Senator Gallinger, the Republican leader, will meet today in the room of the Capitol at 1:30 o'clock Monday afternoon and ride to the White House in carriages. In the committee will be the senior Senators from each state.

Each State Represented. Speaker Clark, Representative Underwood, the Democratic leader; Representative Mann, the Republican leader; Representative Murdock, the Progressive leader, the House committee, will meet at the White House at 2 o'clock and proceed in a body to the east room. The ranking members of each state delegation will compose the committee.

Both in the Senate and House collection arrangements were made today for the purchase of magnificent floral pieces for the funeral. Flowers have arrived from individuals and organizations in all parts of the country. Such a collection has seldom been seen, except at the funerals of Presidents of the United States.

The body of Mrs. Wilson has been placed in a mahogany casket, lined with copper and covered with silver-gray broadcloth and with silver handles. At the grave the casket will be placed in an outer case of steel.

On the casket is a silver plate engraved with the simple inscription: "Ellen Axson Wilson, May 15, 1860-August 6, 1914."

Services to Be Simple. The services Monday in the east room will consist of the reading of the simple Presbyterian rites by Rev. Sylvester Beach, of Princeton, N. J., and Rev. J. H. Taylor, of the Central Presbyterian Church, Washington. Only the family, intimate friends, the Cabinet and the members of the Congressional committees will be present.

After the services the casket will be carried by a group of police officers, who long have guarded occupants of the White House, to a waiting hearse.

A special train consisting of a private car for the casket and the President and his family, a sleeper for a few relatives and intimates, and a dining-car and a baggage-car, will take the party to Rome, Ga.

It will arrive there at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. The funeral will be held immediately in Myrtle Hill Cemetery. At 6 P. M. the President will start back to Washington.

SCHOOL POLICY IS NEW

ST. HELENS PROVIDES FOR STUDENTS WHO HAVE POSITIONS.

Building to Be Open Daily from 9 A. M. to 9 P. M. and Vocational Teaching Will Be Added.

ST. HELENS, Or., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—At a meeting of the School Board this week it was decided to adopt a system that will provide instruction for those at work as well as for those who are not.

The plan is to adopt courses that will attract back to school those who left before their education was completed and also provide such instruction as will prepare attendants for some particular line of work.

Those who hold positions should make arrangements with their employers to be assigned duties involving two to three hours' less time and attend school some time between the hours of 9 A. M. and 9 P. M.

Those who wish to work soon will be given a half day of regular lessons and a few hours in the afternoon in some form of industrial work.

For after-school hours a system of activities will be provided that will afford every pupil an opportunity for regular exercise.

An outdoor playground protected by a large roof will be provided. Then no one team in any line of sport representing the entire school will be formed, but as many teams as can be made up of all the pupils will practice. No inter-school, but inter-class con-

tests will be held. There will be calisthenics, dumb-bells and field drill classes each day for boys and girls alike.

A summary of the School Board's policy follows:

A full course of regular work for the normal pupil. A regular four-year high school course.

In addition practical business courses, industrial arts and sciences. Instruction will be given at night as well as in the regular school hours. The school house will be open in the evening as a public reading-room and library.

A uniform system of outdoor play, in which each student may take part.

The members of the School Board are Dr. Edwin Ross, Judge Hattan and Charles Graham, with Miss Alice Quick, clerk.

YAKIMA WATER INCREASED

Reservation a Mine Ends Just in Time for Farmers.

NORTH YAKIMA, Wash., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—The water famine on the Yakima reservation, where ranchers have been allowed 375 second-feet allotted as their share of the Yakima river's natural flow, terminated yesterday when storage water released by the Reclamation Service two days before reached the reservation canal headgates. This increased the supply 720 second-feet. Hereafter this will be the minimum amount of the reservation's irrigation supply under a provision made by Congress.

The extra supply comes when the reservation ranchers need the water badly. Opening of the headgates yesterday was an occasion for rejoicing among residents on the reservation who were in North Yakima.

BIRDS TO BE SET ON BUGS

Lane Farmers to Import Quail to Fight Crop-Killing Pests.

EUGENE, Or., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—To increase the number of birds, notably bob white, or quail, on the Lane County farms, in an effort to attack the mysterious bugs which are now destroying the corn and bean crops about Eugene, the Lane County Farmers' Protective Association met yesterday in the Commercial Club rooms.

Some farmers report that their corn practically is ruined, and the county bean crop is said to have been cut one-half, partly by the bugs and partly by the dry weather.

The farmers propose not only to obtain shipments of new birds from the state game farm, but to create a sentry men which will protect those already here.

LOWER RIVER LAND DYKED

Thousands of Acres Being Made Available for Farming.

CATHLAMET, Wash., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—Thousands of acres of fertile tide land on the Lower Columbia are being made available for farm land by dyking.

By spring 750 acres on Puget Island will be ready for crops. The Brown Dyking Company, of Portland, has charge of the work and the right of way, seven miles long, has been cleared at a cost of \$19,000. Two dredges are putting in the dyke. The total cost of the project will be \$40,000.

W. P. Smith, of Oak Harbor, Wash., has purchased 1000 acres of tideland between this place and Skamokawa, and with a crew of 40 men, will clear the dyke it ready for settlement in the Spring.

CENTRALIA SETS HOLIDAY

Council Closes Business on Date of Settlers' Reunion.

CENTRALIA, Wash., Aug. 5.—(Special.)—The Centralia City Commission has declared a half holiday for August 12, the date of the annual meeting of old settlers at Rochester.

The Commission also adopted a resolution calling for the paving of North Tower avenue from Fourth to Fifth streets, and Fifth street from Tower avenue to the viaduct leading to the Long district. The Northern Pacific has donated four lots to the city, making the opening of Fifth street possible. The auto fire truck has had trouble in getting to the viaduct because of the poor condition of the approach.
