The measure would add to the corps 12 Colonels, 12 Lieutenant-Colonels, 40 Majors, 174 Capiains, 187 First-Lieu-tenants, 187 Second Lieutenants, a cor-responding quota of non-commissioned officers and 7672 privates, making the total authorized limit' 30,309. 
