After the conversation Rizzo appeared with his attorney before Judge Thomas J. Ford, in Quarter Sessions Court, who fixed bail at \$10,000. This amount will be released. These friends, as well as his attorney say Rizzo killed Distano in self-defense. He was attacked, it is said, by the latter after upbraiding him for applying yile epithets to a 15-year-old girl at a party. Struck by Distano, Rizzo slew his assailant.


