George Kircher's signing with Aberdeen during the week probably ends this young comedy vander's career in the Pacific Coast League. It was brief but meteoric and George left more like a ripple in the breeze than all the Dockstadters and Joe Millers that ever crossed the Columbia.

Dan Murray, ex-Portland Colt catcher, was sold yesterday by Portland to the Spokane team. Murray was scheduled to be second string catcher for the Portland Coasters this year, but when he took down with the muggings in one of the eyes, Mack had to go East and corral Fred Carish. Carish is catching such great ball that there isn't a chance for Murray to ease him out of a berth now that he is convalescent.

Speaking of catchers, Boles of Los Angeles and Carish of Portland appear to possess the steely whips of the circuit. These are the only two regulars who have thrown out more runners than have registered steals against them so far in the race.

Boles has delivered a coroner's card to 17 and has a batting average record of .10 and 7. Gus Fischer, of Portland, ranks third, with 13 and 11, then Kuhn of Oakland and Hannah and Rohrer of Salt Lake.
