*EVERY* tourist who has been in Yellowstone National Park remembers with distinct delight the thrill of amazement experienced in rounding the narrow road that winds along the mountainside into Golden Gate Canyon. This is one of the most inspiring sights in the park. The road overlooks a deep canyon, through which a turbulent mountain stream dashes over its rocky bed picturesquely. From the precipitous sides of the obsidian cliffs across the canyon occasional pine trees rise abruptly from the sparse earth, presenting a refreshing contrast to the somewhat somber hue of the rocky hills. Yellowstone Park will take on added interest for the tourist beginning today, for it is to be opened now for automobile traffic under such restrictions as will preclude interference with the stage service, which is drawn by horses. It is apparent that Yellowstone is growing in popularity with the tourist. The number of visitors to date this year already has exceeded by thousands the entire number last season. It is probable that the use of motor vehicles will cause a large increase in the number of visitors every year.
