Nearly Whole Block in Original Town Is Destroyed.

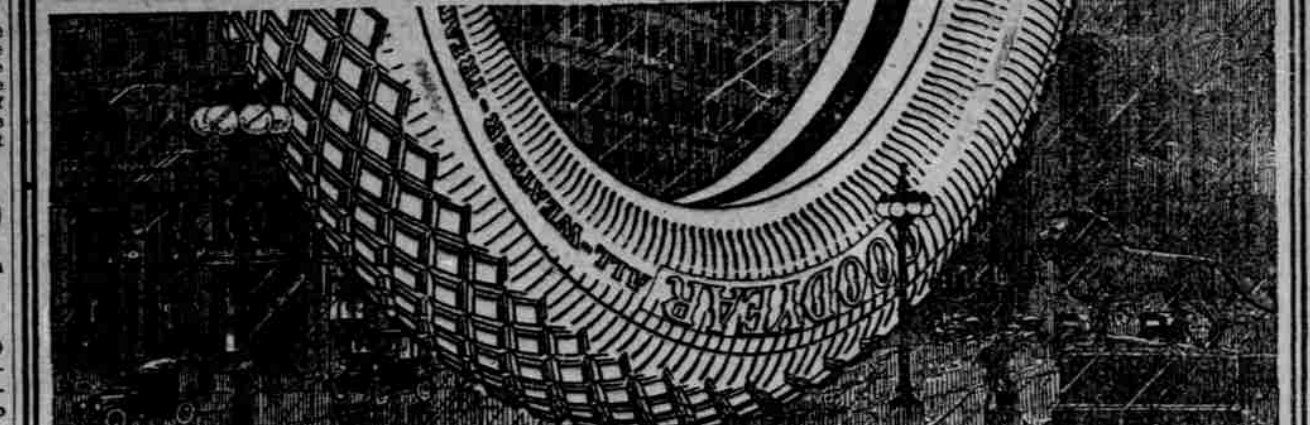

Sentence Follows Plea of Guilty to Swindling Man Out of \$7000 With Aid of Two Companions.

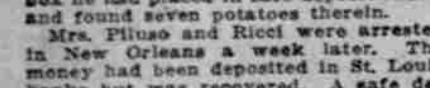
