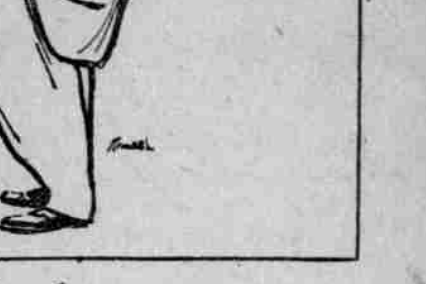

TRIP HERE DIFFICULT

SERBIAN CHESS STAR TRAVELS WITH AUSTRIAN PASSPORT.

Boris Kostic, who met ten Portland players while blindfold, hopes to extend tour to Canada.

Boris Kostic, the Serbian chess master, who was a visitor in Portland during the past week, had a hard time getting to the United States from South America, where he had been for two years.

Kostic, who is a Serbian by birth, left his home in Europe more than six years ago. At that time the present war was unthought of, and as Austria was a larger and better-known country than Serbia at six years ago, Kostic secured an Austrian passport, on which he is now traveling.

When the war broke out and he decided to come to the United States, he found that all the German ships had left the South American ports, and that the British boats would not carry him on account of his Austrian passport.

However, he finally arrived in New York on a freighter.

Although admittedly a master of the art, Kostic has only been playing chess since 1905. In the ten years intervening, however, he has played in South America, Europe and North America, and has won some of the biggest chess tournaments ever staged.

The blindfold champion left Portland for Seattle Thursday and will visit Vancouver and Victoria on his Austrian passport.

While here he met ten players and played blindfold simultaneously. He has not been beaten since he left New York and retained a clean slate here. He won eight games, drew two, and lost one.

Those whom he defeated were E. E. Protzman, F. Stoyanov, Young, Young, of the Acacia Club; John Knight, of the Elks Club; E. F. Rochester, of the Multnomah Club; H. W. Strong, Fred Krueger and C. J. Dillinger.

LOS ANGELES HEFTER WINS Multnomah Club Entry Registers Second in Weight Lifting.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 7.—(Special).—Final results of the 155-pound lifting contest of the Amateur Athletic Union, held under the auspices of the Panama-Pacific International Exposition here last night, gave Noah Young, of the Los Angeles Athletic Club, 41 points; Owen Carr, of the Multnomah Club, Portland, 37; Alexander Karasick, of the Olympic Club, this city, 35; and A. J. Martin, of the Los Angeles Athletic Club, five.

The difference in weight between Carr and Young is a great deal to do with the downfall of the Oregonian. Young tips the beam at 210 pounds, stripped, while the winged "M" weight lifter is almost 60 pounds lighter. Carr broke three amateur records of the United States, but Young managed to do a little better.

Following are the results of the night's lifting: Two-hand curl—Young, 200½ pounds; Carr, 200; Martin, 190. (Old record 170.) One-hand curl—Young, 155; Carr, 150; Young, 157; Carr, 172. (Old record 150.) One-arm press from shoulder to arms' length above the head—Young, 90; Carr, 150. (Old record 126.)

There were no third places in two of the events. Gold, silver and bronze medals were awarded to the winners.
