

CITY BUDGETS SHOW ECONOMIC EFFORTS

Increased Salaries Proposed in Public Safety and Public Works Departments.

APPROPRIATIONS ON LIST

Mayor Wants Five Runabouts for Patrolling Residence Districts, Believing Ten Men Can Do Work Now Requiring 60.

Proposed special appropriations totaling \$356,400 will be faced by the City Council when it takes up consideration in about two weeks of the municipal budget of proposed expenditures for 1916.

Although special appropriations apparently are being sought rather lavishly, the budgets will all show attempts at economy. Except in the police, fire and health bureaus and the various departments of the Department of Public Works salary increases are few and far between.

In the fire bureau Mayor Albee recommends the employment of an additional station chief to enable Fire Marshal Stevens to devote his time to the duties of that office.

In the police bureau Mayor Albee recommends the employment of five runabouts for patrolmen to use in patrolling the residence districts.
