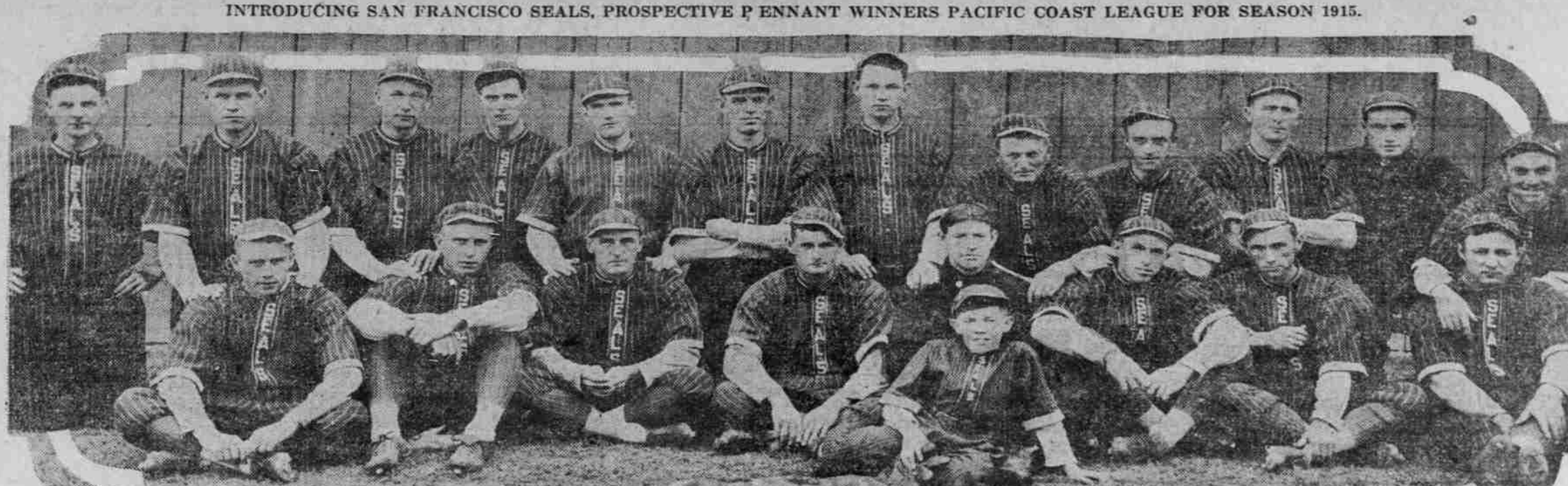

MANAGER OF SEALS NEAR FIRST VICTORY

Showing Made by Wolverton During Other Three Coast Races Is Notable.

YEAR WITH YANKS IS POOR

Heavy Loss by Sacramento in 1914 Cause of Sale to Salt Lake. City Praised for Support, in Proportion to Size.

BY EDWARD HILL. When the Pacific Coast League closes on October 24 and the San Francisco Seals receive the pennant, as it is practically assured they will win it, Harry Wolverton will have won his first flag in the Coast circuit after the seasons of trying with three different clubs.
