A CAMPAIGN for a quarter-million-dollar endowment fund for the Eugene Bible University is claiming the interest of members of the Christian churches of Portland and the entire Northwest. James J. Hill, railroad builder, nas promised to give \$59,000 of this aum if the committees raise the balance. The fund must be completed by March 31, 1916, and must be represented in cash or good marketable interest-bearing securities.

An energetic committee is busy at work, determined that Mr. Hill's generous offer may become a reality and that the institution may be a credit to the entire West.


