CONVICTS TO SEE HER

"Little Mother" Will Stop at Salem En Route Here—Speech Will Be Made at First Presbyterian Church for Public.

Mrs. Ballington Booth, leader of the Prison League, will arrive in Portland Tuesday and speak at the First Presbyterian Church Tuesday night at 7:30, at a public meeting.

Mrs. Booth, affectionately known to the country's prisoners as "Little Mother," was born in Limpfield, Surrey, England, and was the daughter of Rev. Samuel Charlesworth, rector of Limpfield, and then of a large parish in London.

Seventeen years ago they left the organization and founded the Volunteer of America. Since that time Mrs. Booth has made the prison her special care.

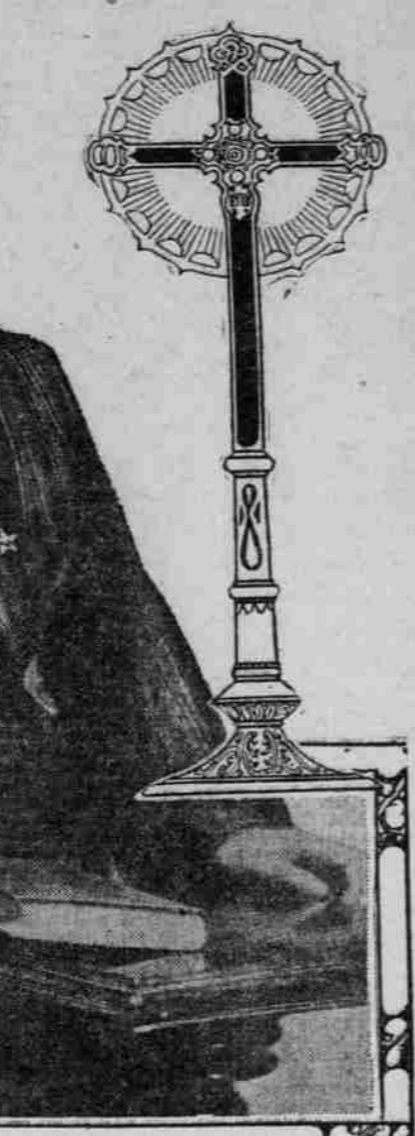
