Frank P. Walsh, in Report to Be Made to Congress, Will Arraign Capitalists, and Particularly John D. Rockefeller, Jr.

Based on two years' searching investigations all over the United States... In a special report prepared by George P. West, investigator for the Commission, John D. Rockefeller, Jr. is charged with full responsibility for the bloodshed and riot which attended the Colorado strike... Scores of other accusations, all founded on Mr. Rockefeller's own testimony and the correspondence between him and his Colorado officials, are made public and will be submitted to Congress at the next session.

He is accused of taking from the letter \$450 yesterday afternoon... After the scene in the marshal's office... Duff then turned to the deputy marshals who witnessed the incident, and asked them to arrest his wife... Duff will appear for trial in the September term of the United States District Court.
