Fight With Seattle Council Makes Mayor More of Gubernatorial Chance.

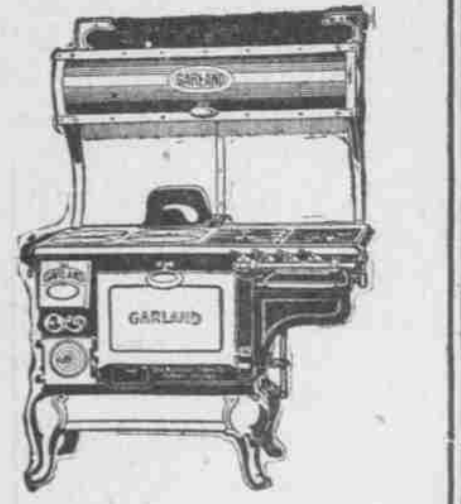

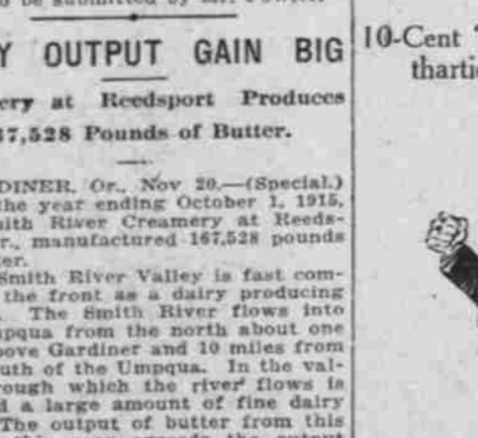
