BONDING COMPANY NO LONGER MAY STAND SPONSOR.

Gradual Departure Noted; Final Extinction of Freak Transportation World Set for Sept. 1, 1916.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Dec. 18.—(Special.)—The early months of 1916 in Washington will see the gradual departure and final extinction of the freak of the transportation world, ushered in by the Winter of 1914-15, the jitney bus.

The decline of the jitney already has become marked, but from present prospects the last it will have disappeared at the latest by September 1, 1916, through a lack of desire on the part of any bonding company to stand sponsor for their operators, as required by the act of the recent Legislature.

The Pacific Coast Casualty Company, the only concern undertaking this line of business, withdrew temporarily from Washington last September, being unable to meet the requirements of the state insurance code. It is now undergoing a process of reorganization, but it is stated unofficially that when it re-enters the Washington field no more jitney business will be written.

It is estimated in the Secretary of State's office that approximately half of the genuine jitney bonds have been canceled by this time.

Other bonding companies are willing to write jitney bonds only if the owners deposit with them \$2500 cash or its equivalent. There is no indication that any business whatever will be done on this basis, as besides paying for the bond the jitney operator would take the risk of losing his \$2500, in case of an accident suffered by passengers or pedestrians.
