Mr. Martin has been talked of for Attorney-General and this is the first time reports of an authentic nature have linked his name with the gubernatorial nomination on the Republican ticket.

National Committee Ingersoll suggests that should the 1916 Republican convention nominate Roosevelt, the Progressives will abandon it to nominate a Presidential candidate and will support the Colonel.

Colonel Roosevelt being the only man who can swing the full Progressive vote to the Republican ticket, there is still a possibility of his being nominated by the Republicans when they meet next January.
