

## NORMAL IS FILLED

Monmouth Training School  
Enrollment Breaks Record.

40 GRADUATE IN JANUARY

History of Institution Since Revival  
in 1910 Is One of Increasing  
Yearly Attendance and  
Importance.

MONMOUTH, Or., Jan. 1.—(Special.)—After a four weeks' session in January, during which time 40 students will be graduated, the Oregon Normal School, now on record with an enrollment unparalleled in its history, will complete four 45 terms of school work since its revival in 1910.

In 1909 the State Legislature failed to make an appropriation for the State Normal at Monmouth, and for one year it lay dormant. In 1910, however, while Oregon had no normal school in operation, the Legislature followed in 1910, J. M. Ackerman, 12 years Oregon Superintendent of Public Instruction, was chosen president, and a faculty of 15 members named. The course of study was revised.

In 4 1/2 years, equipment valued at \$120,000 has been added. In 1912 a \$40,000 girls' dormitory was erected to meet an imperative demand. A central heating plant, costing \$400, was built. A three-acre tract of land, lying between the main normal building and the Monmouth High School, was purchased for \$10,000.

The old gymnasium, in use for more than a quarter century, became inadequate, and a new structure, modern in all its details, run on the campus. Its cost was \$15,000. The growing size of the senior classes, which demanded teaching practice, and the inadequacy of the old training school structure, led to an appropriation of \$10,000 last year for a separate structure. The new building will be completed in one month.

The attendance of the winter session since the opening has more than doubled. Figures for the enrollment and the number of graduates are taken from Registrar Mackey's book, as follows:

The enrollment of the summer session is shown—1912, 122 students; 1913, 280; 1914, 321; 1915, 341.

The correspondence of the administration office indicates that the enrollment will be swelled to large proportions each successive year, as many students plan to enter who have had teaching experience.

Demands for teachers are growing. Annually scores of letters from school boards in country and city districts pour in to the Normal office asking for teachers who can lead in the community. The increasing calls from country districts and the placing of almost one-half of the 1915 senior class in those positions show that the tide has turned to the rural schools," said President Ackerman.

## PIONEER OF 1845 DIES

REV. W. C. GALLAHER SUCCEURS  
AT FREEWATER.

Man Who Was Acclaimed Minister  
When None Was Ready to  
Preach Passes Away.

FREEWATER, Or., Jan. 1.—(Spe-  
cial.)—The Rev. William Crawford Gal-  
laher, Jr., who was born in Putnam  
County, Illinois, in 1825, died here De-  
cember 22 at the age of 89 years.  
In 1845 his father and family started  
from New London Township, Des  
Moines County, Iowa, April 4, and ar-  
rived at The Dalles October 4 of the  
same year.

The emigrants, in flatboats made of  
lumber which they themselves whip-  
sawed, descended the Columbia River  
to the mouth of the Willamette, then  
up that river some 60 or 70 miles to

Lincoln County, where quite a number of  
the company located, going back for  
their wagons and cattle in the Spring.  
William Crawford Gallaher was 19  
years of age at the time of crossing the  
plains. He is
