

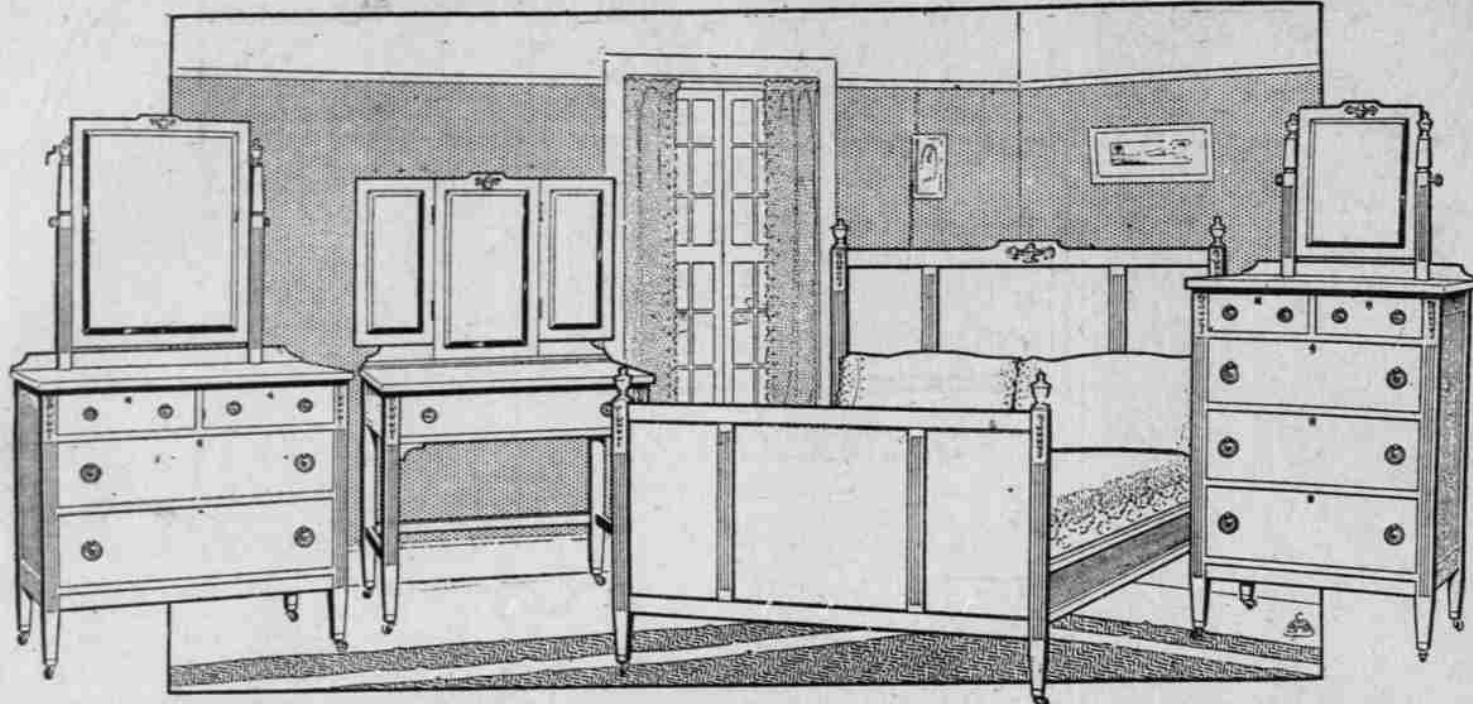

TRAINING SCHOOL BUILDING IS SOON TO BE FINISHED AT STATE NORMAL

Structure Will Be Ready for Occupancy February 1, 1916, and Will Correspond to Other Buildings on Campus at Monmouth.



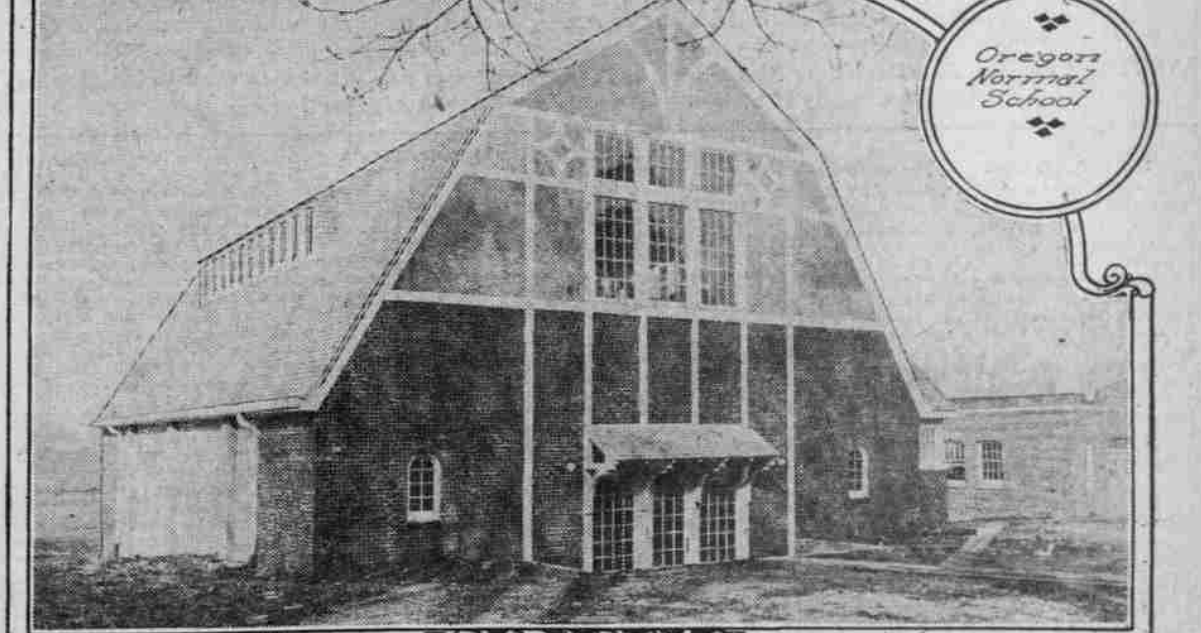
New Training School at Monmouth, Nearing Completion. —Illustration.

MONMOUTH, Or., Jan. 22.—(Special.)—Work on the new \$50,000 state training school building for Oregon Normal School is being rushed and according to present plans the new structure will be ready for occupancy by February 1, 1916. The building is of the old English type and corresponds in large degree to the other structures on the campus.

Under the new plan many small rooms will be provided for the practice teachers. Every student before graduating from the Normal School must acquire 100 hours' of teaching experience, and the training school is to afford facilities where pupils can be taken into private rooms for instruction. Likewise when a teacher grows deficient in certain methods for teaching she can be taken to a small room where the critic teacher will correct the badly-formed habits of the young instructor.

The new structure is the fourth new building to be erected upon the campus in the past four years. A dormitory was built for the use of the girls at a cost of \$60,000, then a heating plant costing \$4000 was put up. Following the demands made by the girls at the school for athletics, a new \$10,000 gymnasium went up. The school has grown in numbers substantially under the new regime. The present enrollment is 356, which is 50 per cent greater than last year.

Roseburg Puzzled Over Dog Problem
ROSEBURG, Or., Jan. 22.—(Special.)—What to do with the stray dogs picked up on the streets here is a question that is causing Mayor Rice and the other city officials no end of trouble. When it was decided to place a ban on dogs here a few weeks ago the Mayor selected a pound near the municipal barn. Two days later a petition was filed with the executive protesting against the housing of dogs in that part of the city. Another pound, located near the City Hall, was then selected. This pound proved a menace to the public, and a second remonstrance was filed with the Mayor. Now the Mayor has instructed the Chief of Police to find another pound in some remote part of the town. Fending the location of the latter pound the dogs are roaming the streets unmolested.
