Furthend and in the office of the Secretary of State at Salem has failed thus far to reveal any trace of the 1882 volume, and the chances are that it is loot for good.

When Assessor Reed took office about three years ago be gathered up all the old rolls in the basement of the Courthouse and stored them in a metal cabinet in his office. When the volumes were checked they were found to be complete and in good order from 1871 forward, but broken between 1815 and 1879.

Inquiry revealed that the missing volumes were either destroyed in the great fire of 1872, which swept away the old Courthouse at Front and Salmon streets, or were lost in the transfer of returns when the new Courthouse was completed a few years ago. It is generally believed that many records were left in the old building on Front street when the officials moved away from there about 18 years ago.
