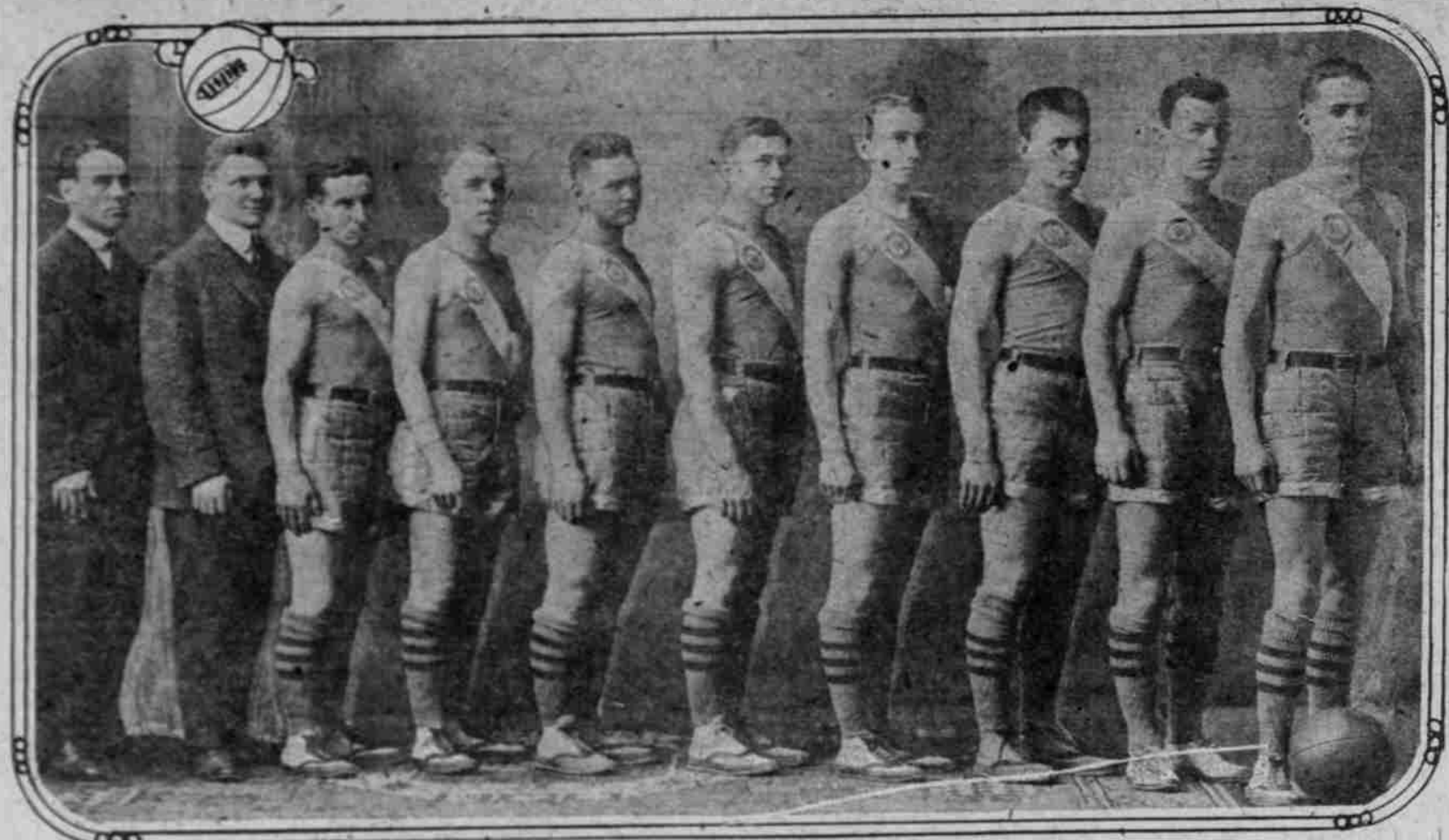

SUNSHINE DESERTS JIMMY COFFROTH

Promoter, Hard Hit by Flood at Tijuana, to Persist in Racing Venture.

RITCHIE OUT FOR MONTH

Broken Rib Hits Willie's Pocket-book, but He Counts on Getting Back in Ring Soon.

Freddie Welsh Explains.

BY HARRY B. SMITH. SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 5.—(Special.)—Jimmy Coffroth and sunny weather are not synonymous in Southern California, or at least over the Mexican border.

Here in San Francisco, when the promoter was a famous handler of prizefighters in the days gone by, he was known far and wide as "Sunshine" Jim Coffroth.

Perhaps he thought his luck would follow him in his racing venture, but the tall man in his racing suit was generally called "Ritchie" by the flood that wiped out Tia Juana and the race course built at an expense of \$200,000.

It was only this week that the final announcement came of the determination of the men in charge to abandon racing for the present.

It is announced that the railroad companies will not be in a position to haul any material into Tia Juana for a month at least, and the men are generally agreed that it would do no good to call a halt for 30 days and then attempt to resume.

Instead, the present winter meeting has been called off entirely.

However, the statement comes that the track to be rebuilt as soon as possible and that a three months' summer meeting will be held, commencing July 3, which will follow after the scheduled meet at Denver, Colo., is held.

By that time there will be no question as to preparedness or as to weather conditions, and it is hoped to make a success of the venture.

Coffroth and his associates have unquestionably dropped a lot of money as a result of the floods that have come, and it will take them some time to recoup their losses.

At the time that the money that has been dropped, Tia Juana has suffered in prestige, and that is going to count with the horsemen.

When Tia Juana was opened the principal advertisement given the section was that racing men didn't need to worry about the tracks, as there would be no rain and no trouble on that score.

Instead, Tia Juana, unluckily, has proved the worst track for rain in the country.

It has been literally drowned out, and they are not going to flock to that part of Mexico again in a hurry.

Coffroth will undoubtedly return to San Francisco, where he has interests here that will keep him busy, and there is nothing to occupy his attention in the San Diego country.

He has a number of interests here that will not necessitate the presence of Coffroth, as it can be conducted by a track superintendent.

At least three or four weeks, work would be at a standstill, and Jimmy loves his San Francisco too much to stay away unless his business cares claim him.

The Juarez and New Orleans tracks will unquestionably claim the horses and horsemen who have been at Tia Juana. Juarez is somewhat closer, and that account may be favored, although the New Orleans affair is the big winter meeting with the asterisk, so far as the horses are concerned.

Willie Ritchie has just written corroborating the news that he is out of the boxing game for three or four months, because of a fracture of the ribs.

It is said that he was in California in still pursuing him.

In his letter, he says: "Had the misfortune to break my ribs, the ninth one, while I was training last week. After four days' work I began to feel a fracture of the ribs, and an examination, and an X-ray, which showed a fracture that means four or five weeks of idleness for me. Had to close the gymnasium, and the big one was with Kid Ted Lewis for January 23, as well as bouts in St. Louis and Memphis."

As a tentative one as well as Milwaukee, I am able to walk around, so that things are not so bad. I might have been forced to remain indoors, as was the case when I had my accident. It looked as if Lewis and I would have drawn a big house. I bumped a corner of the ring while boxing and, when I bothered some of the following day, it was not particularly noticeable until three days later. Then a blow on the back told me there was something wrong, and I had to quit. In any way, it is true, Ritchie is unfortunate, but in others he has been exceptionally successful, and certainly the San Francisco man has no kick about it. Even if he never did another tap of boxing, and he has every prospect of continuing for some time to come, he has managed a competence and that is more than a lot of fighters can say for themselves.

Freddie Welsh, I notice, has issued an "essay" in which he says the lightest hitting boxers are the ones who last the longest in the ring. He says he is justified in using the dance-around-the-ring style that has caused him to be criticized from coast to coast as the "dancing master."

Freddie, of course, argues that by following his style he is able to keep his opponents from tearing into him in slam-bang style, and that as nature did not make him particularly robust, he must use his asset—speed—to save himself as much as possible.

He cites the fact that Abe Attell was not what could be called a terrific fighter, but he was clever and held the title for 12 years.
