Complete List of Country Club Events Scheduled by Chairman Davis.

STATE EVENT JUNE 5-10

Championship Play to Be Held While Rose Festival Is On—Club to Make Bid for 1917 Northwest Title Event.

A complete list of the golfing events at the Waverly Country Club for 1916 was announced yesterday by C. H. Davis, Jr., chairman of the handicap committee, and his assistants, Gordon Voerhies and L. H. Hoffman.

Patterning after a system in vogue at one of the Long Island links, Chairman Davis has arranged all his dates in the form of a large chart. This chart, carefully worked out after hours of patient labor, so as to avoid conflicts as much as possible, will be hung in the beautiful clubhouse at Waverly, and by consulting it the players will be able to tell weeks ahead just what competitions are to be held and when.

State Event June 5-10. The Oregon state championships will be held at the Waverly links June 5-10, as announced by The Oregonian last Sunday. The Rose Festival will be held on three of these dates—June 7, 8 and 9—and prominent clubmen and officials are enthusiastic over Mr. Davis' plan. The first two days' stipulations will have taken place before the festival commences, while the finals on Saturday will take place after the festival has closed its doors.

Rose Festival officials, too, are highly pleased at the arrangement for the dual attraction is sure to bring some people here who would otherwise not have come.

Best Handicap System Used. The best system of handicapping will be used in all the handicap events. This year's championships will be held at Spokane June 26-July 1.
