During the past week the exhibition of the famous Besnard peace painting, "Le Paix," at the Museum of Art on Wednesday night called forth an assemblage of society folk and others who are appreciative of the best in art. A musical programme of high standard was given by Dent Mowrey and George Wilbur Reed and addresses were delivered by Charles H. Carey on "Our Debt to France," and by J. Andre Foulhoux on "Art." The evening was planned for the benefit of the families of French soldier artists and the sponsors were the members of L'Alliance Francaise.

The auction of paintings donated by H. F. Wentz, C. E. R. Wood, Carl H. Walters, Shanna Cumming, Lesley Smith and an exhibition of loan pictures in the upper gallery created added interest.

The Besnard picture depicts peace by arbitration. It should be seen by all who are interested in the fine arts. The exhibit of loan paintings and miniatures contains many gems. There is a Claude Monet loaned by C. F. Adams, a Carot, "A Boy Sketching," loaned by Miss Felling; a Daubigny, a Michel and others of equal interest from the collection of Mrs. Helen Ladd Corbett. E. M. Lazarus has added three Daubigny miniatures. An attractive painting is the "Tempest," by Jules Dupre, which is the property of Mrs. A. L. Mills.
