

WILSON ENDS WITH GRIP OF "COERCION"

President Charges Political Capital Is Made Out of Unsettled Questions.

CONFIDENCE IS ASSERTED

In Concluding Speech of Campaign at Shadow Lawn Charge Is Made That the Republicans Try to Dictate to Voters.

LONG BRANCH, N. J., Nov. 4.—President Wilson closed his campaign for re-election today at Shadow Lawn with a speech in which he accused the opposition of attempting to coerce workingmen and charged that political capital is being made out of unsettled questions.

Pulse Rising, Says Wilson. "Let them fill the country with alarms; the alarms are their own, not ours. They used to control the credit of the country, now they control nothing but the betting."

Local Situation Discussed. "The difference between the Republican party and the Democratic party is this," he continued. "The Republican party offers them masters; we offer them comrades and leaders."
