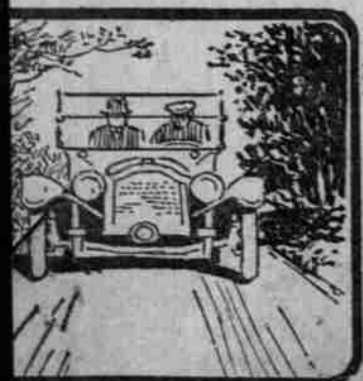
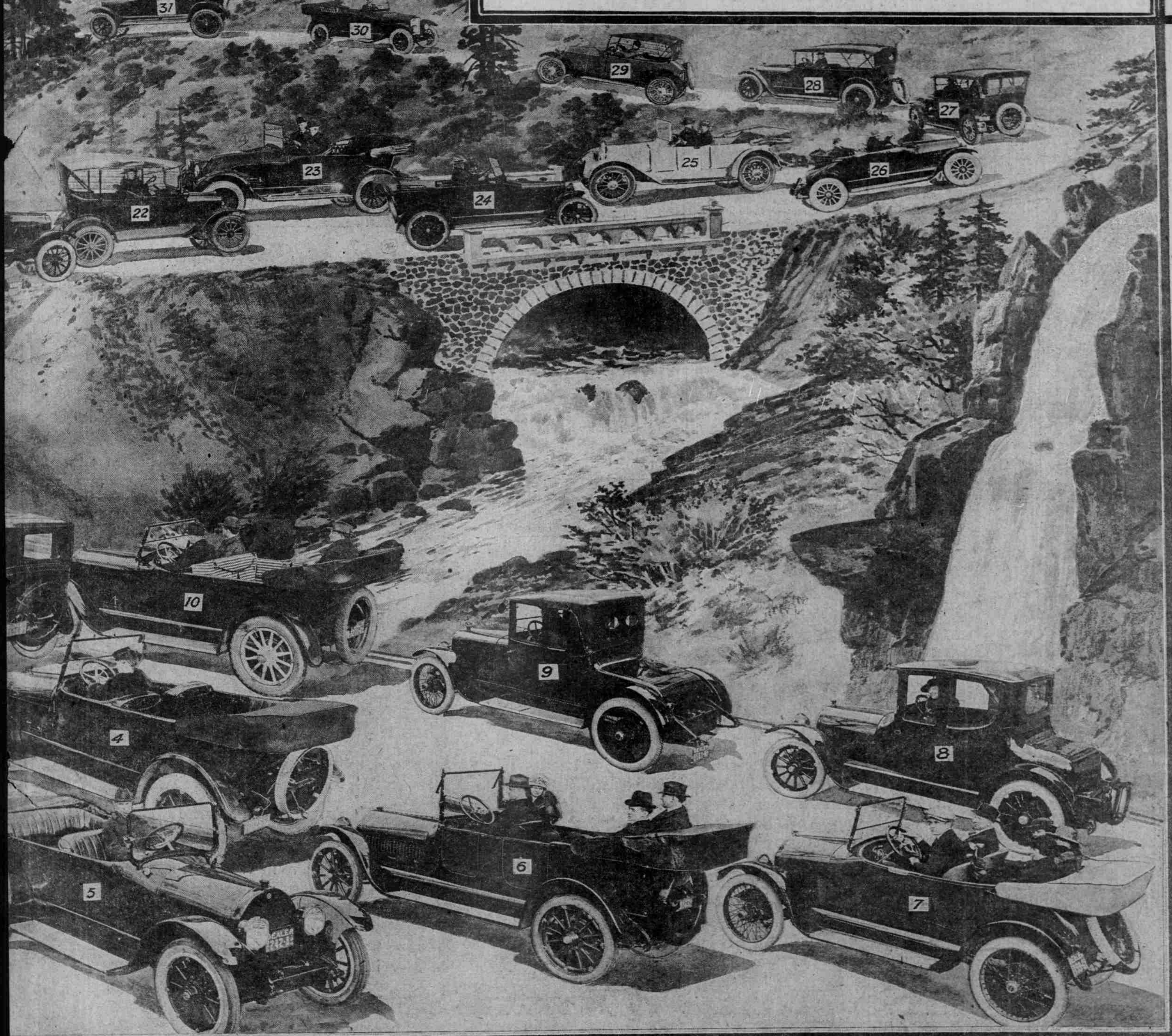


# CARS AND DEALERS AT PORTLAND'S EIGHTH ANNUAL AUTO SHOW.
