Moreover, it has a number of surprises in store for the Germans should they care to come.

The Navy and War departments are co-operating for the purpose of protecting ports. Submarine nets are being placed at the entrances of various harbors and they have been reinforced by stationary mines that will be exploded by electricity the moment contact is made by a ship.

As an indication of the way in which the Navy-yards are being placed in condition to bear the strain of war, it developed today that the electric equipment awaiting installation in public buildings has been turned over to the yards. By this policy the power plant units will be largely increased and it is estimated that the capacity of the yards and the gun foundries where the great guns are turned out for the Army and Navy will be doubled.


