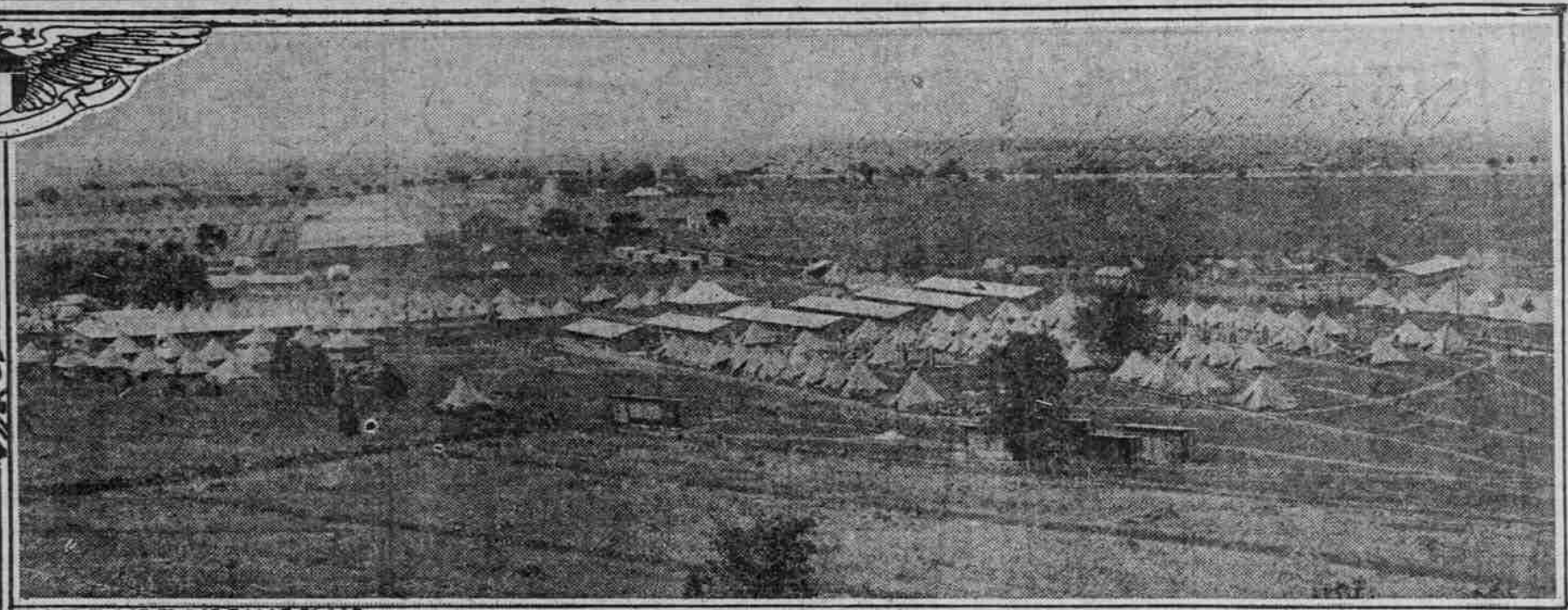

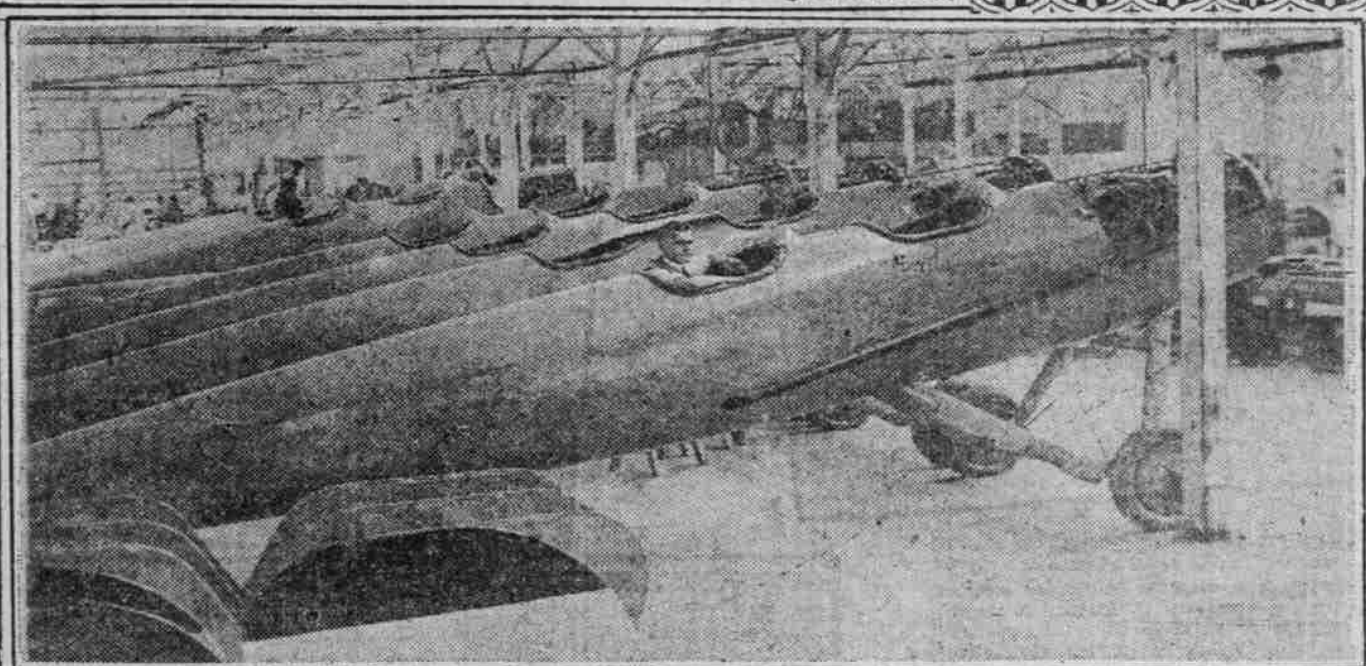

BRITISH tanks have been brought into play in the campaign in the Holy Land and they appeared before the gates of ancient Gaza. Gaza lies about two miles from the Mediterranean protected from attack on its western side by high sand dunes, well fortified. The city is the center of trade and travel over the desert in the south. The armies of Rameses, of Alexander, of the Crusaders, and of Napoleon must have marched across this very landscape.

Charles A. Edison, son of Thomas A. Edison, the electrical wizard, presented to the Fifth New Jersey Infantry one of the new phonographs designed specially for the Army and Navy.

The phonograph is reinforced with iron and can be thrown into an Army wagon or into a ship's hold without damage. The outer case is waterproof and fireproof. It is designed for the open air and can be heard for 200 yards. The machine is exclusive to these branches of the service. Only 200 have been made thus far.

Hundreds of Red Cross ambulance drivers and members of Red Cross Sanitary Units are being trained for service abroad at the training camp of the Army Medical Corps at Allentown, Pa.

"Longshoregirls," clad in khaki overalls and jackets, are driving trolley cars, locomotives, electric winches, cranes, derricks, and other machinery on the docks of the Bush Terminal Company in Brooklyn, N. Y. They are also capable workers on board ship, mounting the rigging with alacrity of old tars.

All the young women are employees of the company and have been trained to fill the places of men in cases of emergency. The company expects to lose a good many men on account of the war and this class was organized to take their places. A demonstration was recently held to convince other corporation officials of the possibilities of woman labor.

The latest types of aeroplanes being built by the Curtiss Aeroplane Company for the United States will be well represented in the great air fleet now in construction for the United States. This biplane is the evolution of the fighting machines that have been in use by the belligerent powers since the beginning of the war. All the modern features are represented.

Cabinet members, most of whom are beyond the military age and are exempt from service, are putting in a daily period of training so that their physical condition will be of the best, and that they may handle their jobs in winning fashion. Good health and vigor are essentials in getting the best out of men. Cabinet members and other government officials realizing this are training under the direction of Walter Camp, the famous Yale athlete.

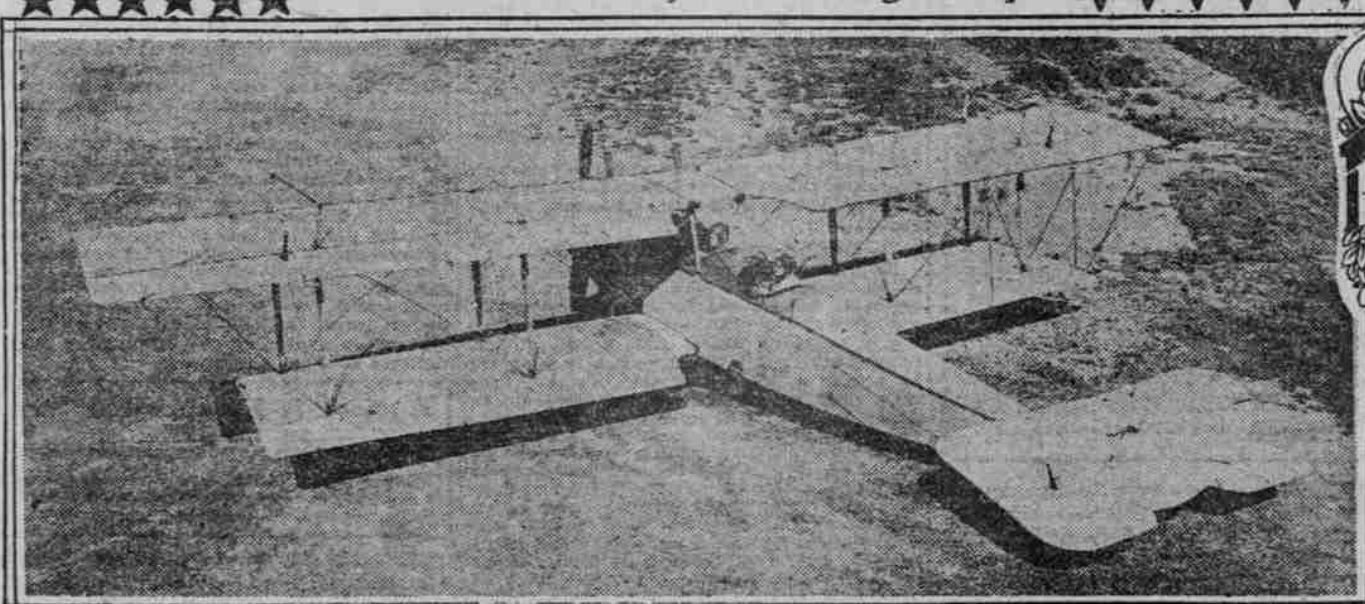
United States Soldier boys in France attract to end of attention wherever they go and they invariably bring cheers from the French spectators.

A great fleet of airplanes is now being built for the American Army and big factories are rushing the various parts and assembling them with all possible speed. Great numbers of new flyers are being turned out every week. Within a few months these machines will probably be carrying American birdmen over the fighting lines in France, clearing the skies of Germans. The commanding General of the German aerial forces attempts to dis-

count the prospective participation of American aviators in the war. He speaks scoffingly of the thousands of aeroplanes constructed and to be built. When American machines start buzzing in the higher altitudes above the firing line, he will change his mind.

German prisoners are working in the American training camp in France. It must be bitter gall for these German prisoners to have to work to

make things comfortable for the American troops.

United States troops are again encamped on the field of Gettysburg. No more historic scene could have been selected for a camp, than this spot, the site of the turning point in the Civil War. On this field where monuments rise everywhere testifying to the bravery of American troops, the soldier of today is in the sort of surroundings

that breeds the fighting spirit that wins.

United States Regulars and several thousand embryonic "Sammy" are in training here learning military tactics. The soldier factory is a busy place and the work goes on smoothly without the slightest semblance of a fuss.

is to be reduced again. All traffic between midnight and 6 A. M., also probably will be forbid. There are now fewer than 135 taxicabs in service, against a normal 275, and this number will be still further reduced. The streetcar service was reduced by more than one-third six weeks ago.

CONEY CLAIMS VICTIMS
Warm Half-Holiday Sends 100,000 People Into Surf.

NEW YORK, July 29.—A warm holiday afternoon attracted 100,000 surf bathers to the beaches at Coney Island Saturday, and a strong undertow kept the lifeguards along the shore so busy that all of them were exhausted last night. The police estimated that the guards had to assist 100 persons from

the water, while it was necessary for them to go out to warn thousands of inexperienced swimmers to remain within the lifelines. Two drownings were reported.

Isaac Auster, of 805 Myrtle avenue, Brooklyn, was caught by the undertow and taken so far out that the guards were unable to reach him immediately. A pulmotor from the Coney Island Hospital failed to restore Auster to consciousness. Jacob Finkelshtein, of 168 Lenox avenue, was drowned at the foot of East Thirtieth street, despite the efforts of lifeguards and other swimmers to get him to shore. He had been warned of the undertow and instructed to remain within the lifelines.

Germans Export Belgian Food.

STOCKHOLM, July 10.—While Belgium goes hungry the Germans are exporting Belgian vegetables and fruits. Large quantities of Belgian asparagus

and hothouse peaches have been on sale in Stockholm's leading shops for weeks. It is also worthy of note that certain shops are advertising women's costumes imported direct from Vienna.
