BRITISH FRONT IN FRANCE AND BELGIUM

Oct. 5.—(Delayed.)—The Germans suffered severely in the British attack Thursday, and a trip along the British front east and north of Ypres showed hundreds of bodies of German soldiers in the debris. At many places shell craters were filled with dead. Here and there were wounded, sometimes under a pile of corpses, which the British stretcher-bearers had not been able to reach.

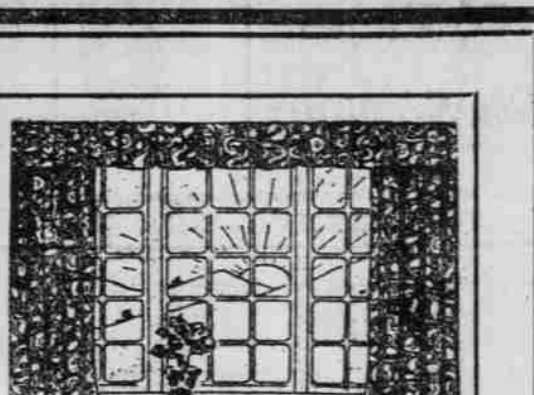
