

GRAND OPERA WEEK MOST SUCCESSFUL

Two Fine Performances, "Carmen" and "Il Trovatore," Given by La Scala Co.

PROCEEDS ABOUT \$20,000

Expenses of Productions Have Been Heavy and Promoters Do Not Expect Much Profit Has Been Made.

With two fine performances of "Carmen" and "Il Trovatore," the week of grand opera in the public Auditorium has come to a successful close. When the curtains were lowered last night on the prison cell of our old relative, Manrico, in "Il Trovatore," we felt that we were bidding good-bye to good friends to the members of La Scala Grand Opera Company.

It was learned late last night that the gross proceeds for the eight performances of grand opera—including the two matinees—were about \$20,000. The expenses of such an undertaking are of course heavy and it is stated that when accounts are balanced, the managers will just about "break even." There will probably be a small profit balance.

Mr. Barry said afterward that he was satisfied with his opera venture in this city. "I consider Portland a first-class city for grand opera," he went on. "We consider that Portland is the best natural music and grand opera city on the Pacific Coast. People in this city are, however, a trifle difficult to stir up to attend grand opera, and we could have taken care of larger audiences. BREACH OF FAITH CHARGED

BEND, Or., Oct. 13.—(Special.)—These photographs show scenes taken at the Bend lumber mills, during the campaign conducted here for the sale of Liberty Loan bonds this week. Rev. J. E. Snyder, of Bend, with M. R. DeLong, of Portland, addressed a typical mill crowd. The force at the saw and door factory quit work to hear the speakers, and the camera man snapped 20 of the girls who are patriotically taking places in the mills made vacant by heavy enlistment in the Army and Navy. Women as well as men employees subscribed liberally to the loan bonds, and from the two big mills in Bend and the logging camps which supply them with raw material more than \$50,000 was pledged. TEACHERS ARE WRATHY

REVOCATION OF L. MARKEY'S CERTIFICATE ASKED.

Easton, Wash., Principal Who Attacked Liberty Loan, Repeats Offense After Apologizing.

ELLENBURG, Wash., Oct. 20.—(Special.)—Superintendent McCullough, of Ellensburg, Superintendent Whitcomb, of Easton, W. P. Stephens, head of the Department of Education of the State Normal School, principals of every high school in the county and of several grammar schools, as well as all other teachers who attended the trial of Lynn Markey yesterday, signed a petition to be forwarded to State Superintendent Mrs. Preston asking that Markey's teacher's certificate be revoked and that his conduct be investigated by the Federal Department of Justice.

RIVER SURVEY IS URGED

SENATOR CHAMBERLAIN ASKS IMMEDIATE ACTION.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Oct. 20.—Senator Chamberlain today asked the chief of engineers to order a survey looking to a 35-foot channel in the Columbia River from the mouth to Vancouver. He was told the River and Harbor Board had been asked by the Secretary of War to submit a report on this item, estimated to cost \$15,000. The survey can only be made by order of Secretary Baker, the chief of engineers said.

There is an adverse report on file from the local engineer officer at Portland who apparently does not understand that the 35-foot channel is desired from Portland to the sea, for his objection is directed against the 35-foot channel to Vancouver from Portland, when there is only 27 feet at points in the Lower Columbia channel.

GOVERNMENT HAS CHANGE

Migratory Bird Regulations Made Effective on October 15.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.—The United States Department of Agriculture announces the promulgation of amendments to the migratory bird regulations, effective on and after October 15. One of the changes permits migratory game birds to be hunted from half an hour before sunrise to sunset during the open season, subject, however, to the provisions of state laws restricting shooting during that time.

ROOSEVELT RECORD OUT

Cattle Rustlers of Montana Rapped by Colonel 30 Years Ago.

HELENA, Mont., Oct. 15.—Thirty years ago cattle rustlers were the subject of attack by Colonel Theodore Roosevelt, according to an old minute book of the Montana Stock Growers' Association, which recently was brought here. The entry of Colonel Roosevelt's cattle brand, filed in 1885, also has been found in the office of the recorder of marks and brands here.

FOREST LANDS REOPENED

Parts of Willowa and Fremont National Forests Restored.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—Upon the recommendation of Secretary of Agriculture Houston, the President has signed proclamations excluding certain areas from the Willowa and the Fremont National forests in Oregon, and restoring the public lands therein subject to disposition to homestead entry in advance of settlement or other forms of disposition. Such lands will become subject to entry only under the homestead laws requiring residence at and after November 15, and to settlement and other forms of disposition on and after November 22, 1917. There will be restored under these proclamations about 6845 acres in the exclusion

from the Willowa National forest in Willowa County, Northeastern Oregon, generally rolling grazing lands with some agricultural tracts, and about 28,435 acres in the Fremont exclusion, in Lake and Klamath counties, Southern Oregon, more or less valuable for grazing and with very little agricultural value.
