

FOUR 'DESSERTERS' INDUCTED ONCE

Questionnaire Exposes Men Who Left Montana Without Answering Call.

OFFENSE HELD TECHNICAL

Names Withheld, as Acceptance of Service is Prompt and Departure Apparently Was Due to Misunderstanding.

Operation of the selective service law has resulted in locating in or near Portland four men who had been posted in Montana as deserters because they failed to respond when called for examination for the first draft.

One of the men thus located has already been inducted to military service, and in the act of inducting according to members of the Multnomah County Exemption Board, No. 11. All of the Montanans thus found to be delinquents in the first draft had their status disclosed when they sent addresses or had messages sent back to their local boards to learn when their questionnaires might be expected.

It seems that the four men in this county had not intentionally avoided the examinations in connection with the first draft, but had merely taken for granted that they would not be called, at the same time neglecting to leave or send their new addresses. More men were called, it is understood, than they had supposed would be required.

To save the necessity of the needless trip back to their homes, permission is now being obtained for the remaining three of the men to take their physical examinations here. If found qualified they will be inducted to the service at once.

As the men have shown good spirit in the matter and are not objecting to the penalty of immediate induction to military service their names have not been made known.

DESERTER CAUGHT HERE

CAPTAIN LEE CLARK RECOGNIZES MAN IN STREET.

Bert Gatliff, Arranged as Cowboy, Armed and With Pockets Full of Jewelry, Taken Into Custody.

Bert Gatliff, former member of the Oregon Field Artillery, faces prosecution as a deserter because of the good memory possessed by Captain Lee M. Clark, of the National Guard Reserve. Passing Gatliff on the streets of Portland Friday night, Captain Clark recognized him as a man he had listed in the artillery at Pendleton. Gatliff's home, and who subsequently failed to report for service. An officer was called and made the arrest.

When the Pendleton man, garbed as a typical cowboy, was searched, he was found to be armed with a revolver of large caliber and a knife. Officers who were present say that he also had in his pockets a miscellaneous collection of jewelry, including about 25 lodge emblems and two pairs of diamond earrings.

The prisoner, after being held in the county jail over night, was taken yesterday to face courtmartial proceedings at Vancouver.

Leo Bell, arrested in Portland Friday by F. M. Wright, is another alleged deserter who has been taken to Vancouver. It is charged that Bell deserted last April in the Oregon Coast Artillery only to desert.

These arrests make a total of five men posted as deserters who have been apprehended since the list of names of such characters wanted by the Government was issued three weeks ago from the Adjutant-General's office.
