Government Discharges Principals From Army and Declares Order and Tranquillity Is Re-estabilshed.

MADRID, Jan. 5 .- It is officially anounced that Spain is tranquil every-The number of non-commis sioned officers removed from the army beenuse of their activities in forming "juntas of defense" has reached 1500.

(By the Associated Press.)

MADRID, Jan. 4.—This morning's
newspapers appeared with editorials
expressing great perturbation because the Council of the Ministers was held unexpectedly yesterday evening. The newspapers assert that the Council was made necessary by military meetings of a revolutionary character that have been held recently by corporals, brigade sergeants and non-commissioned officers of the different branches of army. The press asserts that these minor officers are attempting to establish "juntas of defense" similar to those formed by the chiefs and high officers of the army.

The government has issued an order that all branches of the army shall remain in barracks, and also has discon-tinued telegraphic and telephonic com-munication and taken other important precautionary measures such as dis-solving the Parliament.

The news of the revolutionary move-ment has caused a great sensation, and public opinion appears to be with the King and the government. Several popular manifestations of loyalty have been made within the last few days, and the chief of the Conservatives has visited the president of the Council to offer his support.
