APACHE DANCE WILL BE SEEN AT HEILIG THEATER THIS WEEK

Mizzi Hajos, "Baby Star" in "Pom-Pom," Recommends New Dance to All Women Who Are Anxious to Reduce Their Figures and Increase Vigor.



It has taken a French composer, Hugo Felix, of "Madame Sherry" fame, to make generally possible the strenuous Apache dance of the French slums. This he did in his new comic opera, "Pom-Pom," at the Heilig this week. He wrote it for Mizzi Hajos, the Henry W. Savage company's "baby star" and it is the "Pom-Pom," the Pickpocket, dressed as a picturesque ragamuffin in boy's clothes, who with a girl larger and heavier than herself is giving one of the cleverest representations of the dance of the habitues of the Paris underworld yet seen on the American stage.

This takes place in a notorious den of thieves, the historic Black Elephant. It is a underground resort, barbarously decorated by Joseph Urban, is crowded with beggars, impostors and crooks in the operatic scene of "Pom-Pom," who leer and leer as the savagery of the dance grows wilder, or are uproarious at the humor of it brought to the surface by Mizzi as a comedienne and Felix as a composer.
