CONFUSION IN COFFEE MARKET Trade Awaits Details of Food Adminis-

Trade Awaits Details of Food Administration Control.

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—Pending official announcement of datails connected with Food Administration control of the green coffee business expected on Monday, there was continued pervousness and confusion in the fatures market here early today.
