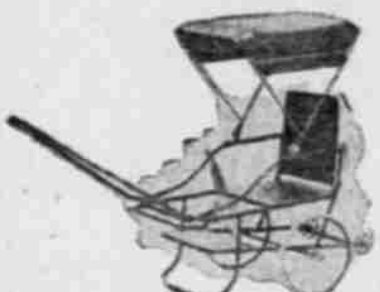

The photoplay offering will be little Madge Evans in "Wanted—A Mother."

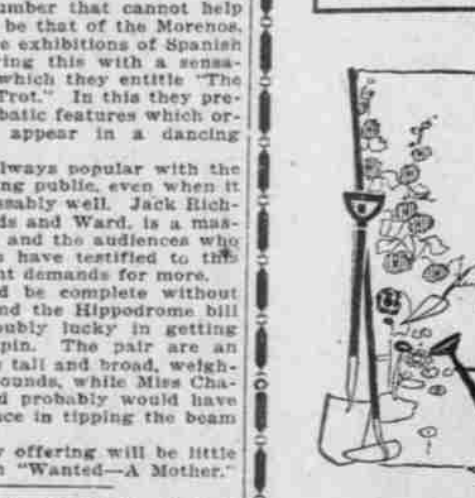
STRAND GETS SCREEN STARS

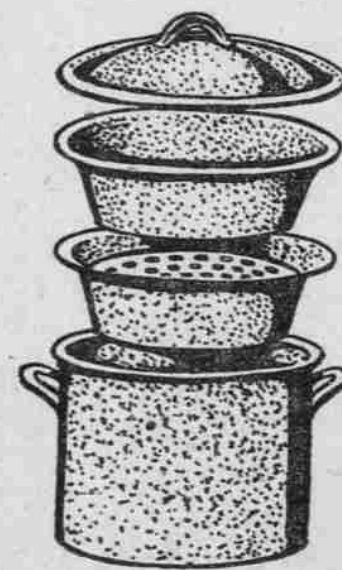
