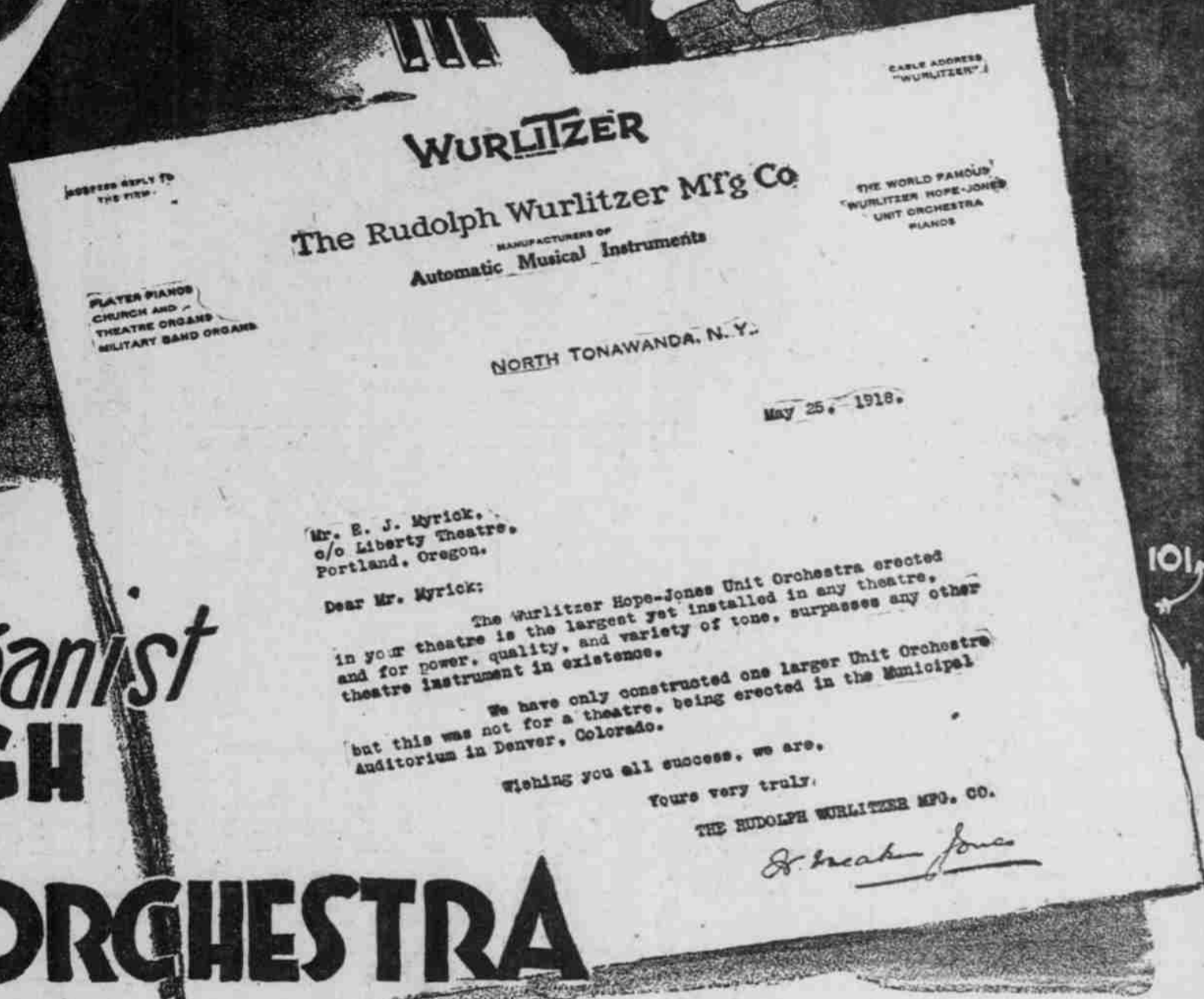


Today—the \$50,000. Organ

It is with the feeling that the City of Portland has at last joined hands with her greater sisters of the East in the possession of the Perfect Picture Playhouse, that the last touch toward that perfection is completed in the opening today of the mastodon of music, the \$50,000 Wurlitzer Unit Orchestra.

The Perfect Picture Playhouse means more than the mere showing of films on a blank screen; that was accomplished years ago with the projection of the earliest efforts in photo-plays and was usually in either an old hall or a remodeled store. With the arrival of the higher plane of photo-play naturally came a better and more perfect playhouse, and with it its allies, perfect service, perfect view and acoustics and, at last, perfect music.

The Liberty, the Perfect Photo-Playhouse, has linked these allies into a chain that is extended from entrance to exit, combined with a theme, the highest in development of the age in theatrical construction and refinement and a screen on which is projected none but the clean, the wholesome, the refined in motion pictures.

Of the Liberty Theater the people of Portland may well be proud, for it ranks shoulder to shoulder with the Picture Palaces of the East and excels all others in its monster organ, played for the first time today by the acknowledged premier of organists, Henri B. Murtagh.
