## NAVY SEEKS OPPONENTS

OF STRONG OPPOSITION FACES ANNAPOLIS ELEVEN,

Financial Difficulties May Prove In surmountable: West Point Game Probably Off.

ANNAPOLIS, Md., June 29 .- (Special.) -The matter of proper opponents for the Naval Academy football team is being given a great deal of consid-eration by the members of the naval contingent. The solution depends entirely upon financial considerations. Strong teams can be brought to Annapolis If a sufficient guarantee is offered. If it is not, they say frankly they will not come. Under present conditions the Naval Academy cannot offer large guarantees, so that means of procuring more money for the paragraphs. of procuring more money for the pur-

Pose are being considered.

The matter is of particular moment at this time, because there is no reaat this time, because there is no rea-son to believe that the game against the West Point team will be played next season, and, further, many naval people believe that they will have the strongest team in the country next season if they can only have a suf-ficient incentive in the right kind of opposition. West Virginia Wesleyan is, at present the only team on the schedule that looks as if it will be able to give the midshipmen a hard for the last two Saturdays in November. The last is being kept with the hope that somehow the Army game can be played, and the management still is hoping that one of the big teams may fill the other date for the final local games, though there are no final local games, though there are no

prospects now.

Congress now makes an appropriation for the equipment of the teams, and it is thought that it might be willing to provide a sum for guarantees when it is demon-strated that games of the right kind

cannot be played otherwise.
