

PIGSKIN LOCKING TO GIRL DESPERATE

Discontinuance of Intercollegiate Athletics During War Is Frowned Upon in West.

GRIDIRON SPORT POPULAR

Any Number of Attractive Contests Scheduled Between Big Varsity Eleven of United States for Coming Fall Season.

Followers of gridiron sport throughout the country are not the least worried regarding the future of the pigskin game, despite the heavy income war has made in the intercollegiate football ranks. This fact was evidenced in a small way at a meeting recently held in Philadelphia, where presidents of the Western conference gathered at the solicitation of President Bryan, of the University of Indiana, for a discussion as to whether it would be advisable to discontinue intercollegiate athletics during the period of the war. The lack of affirmative action in the above matter was heralded as indicative that the gridiron game was in for a good season.

Gridiron Sports Favored.
Representatives were present from practically every intercollegiate institution in the East, and the opinion of the coaches and students was unanimously in favor of a resumption of the gridiron sport in no unlimited terms.
The absence of Yale, Harvard and Princeton delegates, especially in view of the more or less general rumors that these three universities would not play football this fall, was the subject of comment. Their failure to send representatives is not regarded as a reflection on the interest that attaches to the game, because in 1917 this same trio absented themselves.

A meeting similar to that held in Philadelphia also took place in Chicago in the Spring when directors of the western conference held a most encouraging meeting, named officials for all the games and drew up a complete schedule, which means that football will attract its usual share of interest in the Middle West when the Autumn leaves begin to drop.

One of the most encouraging elements in the rosy outlook for football this fall is the fact that the game will again compete with conference football for the first time since 1905. This will help no doubt greatly to stimulate the enthusiasm lost since the present great conflict.

We will have football in our own midst when the next season opens, and the Pacific Coast intercollegiate conference rolls around. At a meeting of the Coast conference representatives held in this city last month it was decided to continue athletics in no small way. A schedule was drawn up and each of the representatives returned from the meeting confident that the heavy loss of varsity material each school would be able to supply a representative eleven.

Youngsters to Maintain Tradition.
Football played by youngsters a bit less formidable in experience and poundage, but sufficiently agile and mentally alert to provide lively and exciting games and retain traditions dear to most colleges will be the programme dished up for gridiron followers this fall.

Perhaps the biggest growth of football during the coming season will be in our Army and Navy camps. A decided success last fall, when play under often discouraging conditions, it is certain there will be great improvement as to fields and equipment, and that will undoubtedly stimulate more interest in the gridiron among those unacquainted with the sport. Athletic life in the camps last year was it was astonishing the way the soldiers took to the pigskin game. It unquestionably hardened the men who played.

Between the collegiate and the service eleven there isn't the remotest doubt but there will be football plenty.

FABRE LIVES NAVY

Former Athletic Director Is Stationed at Bremerton.

INSTRUCTORSHIP IS GIVEN

Ex-Portland Coach Assigned to Duty at Training School; Bout Is Won Against 170-Pounder Recently at Navy School.

Leon Fabre, Jr., one of Portland's well-known athletic directors and coaches, now a member of the Navy, was in Portland Friday for a few hours. Fabre enlisted in the Navy May 22, and is stationed at the Bremerton Naval Training School.

Fabre started his athletic career at Multnomah Club in 1907 as a gymnastic leader. In 1908 he decided to take up wrestling, and from 1908 until 1912 he represented the "Winged-M" institution on the mat. When he began wrestling in the past season prior to his enlistment, he won the city championship at 145. He won the city championship at various weights a number of times and also the state championship. In 1912 he turned coach and spent his initial season piloting and training the Christian Brothers' basketball team and handling the gymnasium classes.

Coach Wins Success.

He met with great success from the start and rapidly came to the fore as a gymnastic instructor and coach. Once more he started to specialize in wrestling, and in 1912 received the position as athletic director and wrestling coach at Lincoln High School. At the same time he also was wrestling coach at Washington High School. He remained at Lincoln until 1917, when he took up the direction of athletics at Franklin and Washington High schools. During that time he was at Lincoln he also coached track and assisted in basketball and football.

During the past season prior to his enlistment, Fabre was gymnasium instructor at the B'nai B'rith Club and coached the B'nai B'rith basketball team and the independent championship of Oregon.

In 1916 two of his wrestling pupils won the championship at their respective weights at the Pacific Northwest Association meet here. They were Lionel Dalton and Orrin Harrison. Dalton won the 115-pound title and Harrison the 115-pound championship.

Fabre likes the Navy life fine. He has been assigned as wrestling instructor at the training school and will commence his duties upon his return to Bremerton. Leon had a wrestling match with a big 170-pounder named Nelson, who recently plumed his man for the second time in a little more than a minute.

New Work Out Together.

Lawrence Duff, former Multnomah Club wrestler and boxer, who won the lightweight wrestling championship of the Northwest in 1908, is a first-class cook at the Bremerton Training School and Fabre work out daily together.

At Byers, former Multnomah Club featherweight and lightweight boxer also is at the training school and is doing a little boxing on the side for the entertainment of the rookie sailors. Bill Williams, a Spokane heavyweight boxer, who recently plumed his Navy, is boxing instructor of the school. Another fellow by the name of Douglas is swimming instructor.
