

DEAR MOVEMENT ON

Heavy Shipments of Bartlett's
From Southern Oregon.

EASTERN MARKETS STRONG

Carloads Forwarded to Date Aggregate
172—Total Shipments Last
Season Were 601 Cars—Other
Fruits Sent Out.

The Oregon Bartlett pear crop is now moving freely to the Middle Western and Eastern markets. Bartlett is shipping at the rate of 12 cars a day and to date has sent forward 172 cars. Total shipments from Bartlett last season were 601 cars. The shipments reported yesterday were 1 car each to Baltimore, New Orleans, Pittsburg, Salem, Philadelphia and Los Angeles; 2 to Toronto, 2 to New York and 10 to Chicago. The Bartlett market was reported strong with current prices of \$2.00 to \$2.50 for fancy and \$1.50 to \$2.00 for "C" grade. Carloads paid \$2.00 to \$2.50. Oregon Bartlett were quoted at Chicago at \$2.50 to \$3.00. At New York the price on Oregon was \$1.00 to \$1.25. Washington pears ranged in these markets from \$2.00 to \$3.50.

The local pear market was slow yesterday with a wide range in quality and condition and prices ranging from \$1.50 to \$2.50.

Carlet shipments of Washington pears were reported as follows: 1 each to Boston, Chicago, Denver, New York and Pittsburg; 2 each to Des Moines, Peoria, Kansas City, Salt Lake, Calgary, Washington, Nashville, Utica, Milwaukee, Watertown, Sioux City, Philadelphia, Watertown, Toledo, Grand Island, LaCrosse and Sheldon; 2 each to Detroit, Denver and St. Louis; 3 each to Minneapolis and New York; 4 to Seattle; 5 to Minneapolis; 6 to Omaha; 14 to Pittsburg, and 20 to Chicago.

California shipped 1 car each to Boston, Cleveland, Detroit, New Haven, Hartford, Montreal, Portland, Sacramento, Santa Rosa and Oakland; 2 cars each to Omaha and Sacramento; 3 cars to San Francisco; 19 cars to Chicago and 23 cars to New York. Cannery's stock 1 car to Sacramento and Oakland; 2 each to San Francisco and Santa Clara.

Among the deciduous fruit shipments reported from Oregon were:

Plums—Chicago, 6; Junction City, 1; Hutchinson, 1; Pittsburg, 2; Lincoln, 1; Minneapolis, 1; St. Louis, 1; St. Paul, 1. Mixed fruit—Spokane, 1; Chicago, 1.

FRENCH CEREAL CROPS BENEFITED

Outlook Is for Good Yield of Wheat in
United Kingdom.

Foreign crop conditions are summarized in Broomfield's cable as follows:

France—Partial reports were had which were beneficial to late spring cereals and forest crops. Harvesting reports continue to be received from many parts of the country. Wheat in the south turning out well and quality excellent. In some areas winter barley is all gathered and a part threshed, giving a medium yield.

North Africa—Reports confirm the completion of harvesting with the results very satisfactory. French traders are awaiting the first lots of wheat and oats, which are currently needed.

Spain—Harvesting reports mention variable yields, but outlook on the whole considered fair. This season's imports estimated at 1,000,000 bushels.

Italy—Adverse mention that the southern harvest is turning out well and practically completed. Reports of wheat crops are satisfactory with average yield indicated. Crops in the north district have had too much rain.

United Kingdom—Outlook is for a good crop of wheat. Last report of condition was 95.2 per cent as 53.8 per cent last year. Harvesting continues at a rapid pace. Indications are that barley and oats will be below the average as a result of a recent period of drought.

Romania—Reports of indications are inclined to be poor, but reports of corn show some moderate improvement.

California Elbertas, Crawford and Lovells were quoted at \$1.25 to \$1.50, according to quality and condition. Yakima quoted Elbertas and Shopsy at 85 cents truckload.

The cantaloupe market was firm with very light supplies on hand. Heavier receipts are expected in the coming week. Yakima started a carload of cantaloupes on Friday. Grapes are holding steady.
