CARDINALS ARE HARD PUT

St. Louis National Baseball Club Faces Heavy Obligations.

The affairs of the St. Louis National League club will come to a head in February, according to Ed Ray, the St. Louis baseball critic. Subscribers to the \$50,000 bond having provisionally received circulars announcing the issue of the second deed of the trust, or the equivalent, for the club, dated January 15, 1918, covering their assessment. In addition the proviso is attached that \$150,000 more, to enable the club to stagger through the winter, will be issued.

This means that in addition to the \$150,000 still due Mrs. Britton, the club will have to settle a second indebtedness of about \$50,000, with interest. This falls due in midwinter, and unless more "angels" can be found, the Cardinals will be knocked down to the highest bidder.
