

WAR WORK CAMPAIGN STARTS NOVEMBER 11

Chief Officers Are Selected for Oregon Drive.

STATE QUOTA IS \$770,000

Seven Welfare Organizations Unite in Effort to Assist Boys on Foreign Fighting Front.

Announcement of the chief officers of the united war work campaign for Oregon was made yesterday by Orlando W. Davidson, state director. They will have supervision over the various features of the big drive for funds which is scheduled for the week of November 11. A total of \$770,000 is to be raised throughout the country, to be administered for military men by the Y. M. C. A., Y. W. C. A., Knights of Columbus, Jewish Welfare Board, Salvation Army, War Camp Community Service and the American Library Association.

W. M. Ladd is general chairman; Mr. Davidson, director; John W. Kelly, associate director; Mrs. William H. Marshall, associate director; J. W. Day, speakers' and entertainers' bureau; Ira F. Powers, director of publicity; Walter A. Goss, in charge of the victory boys' and girls' feature; John H. Rudd, in charge of college and university students' work.

Director Davidson has completed organization by counties, having a chairman in each district and a secretary. They will have their own committees corresponding to the other officers for the drive and even school districts will be covered in such a manner that every one will be canvassed for funds before the drive is finished.

Oregon's share of the total is about \$770,000. The seven welfare organizations are uniting in the drive by order of President Wilson, whose campaign is to obviate the necessity of more campaigns for funds for them and also to unify all factions insofar as the administering of the various war work drives in the field is concerned.

In the battle zones creeds and denominationalism, it is pointed out, are not emphasized, but, instead, the ministrations of all go to every soldier or sailor needing attention. At the same time, as the President has said, it is not desired that either organization should lose its identity, but that, rather, each should minister to its peculiar following in its own way.

"For the boys over there" is the motto of the drive and that is the sole reason why the people of Oregon are to be asked for funds.

No detail of the campaign will be overlooked to make it a complete success and to inform the people of the state regarding the various features.

The work of each organization concerned will be fully explained to every community through every possible means. Before long general headquarters will be established in Liberty Temple, from where all of the patriotic drives are handled, and a concerted campaign will be directed into every nook and corner of the state.

DANCE STANDARD AT ISSUE

'CLOSED' POSITION TO RECEIVE OFFICIAL ATTENTION.

Portland Dancing Masters' Association Organizes to Co-operate With Chief of Police Johnson.

With a view of standardizing the waltz and the "closed" position in dancing, a new organization has been formed in this city. It will be known as the Portland Dancing Masters' Association. Mose Christensen is president; Axa Genevieve Paget, vice-president; Miss Ireland, secretary, and M. M. Kingler, treasurer. Professor O. C. Mauthe, of the M. A. C.; M. DeHoney and A. C. Holmes, of the Laurelhurst Club, are the directors.

The main idea to confer with Chief of Police Johnson and his three women inspectors, as well as all teachers interested in the movement, the park and playground, roads, and operate in dances, specializing in the waltz and the "closed" position, which has aroused criticism in the past. As the modern dance position has been approved by Chief Johnson and his associates, it is probable that a change will be made in the old ordinance permitting the dancing positions to be brought up to date.

The positions, as demonstrated by Professor Mauthe in his classes in the Multnomah, are as those adopted by the American National Dancing Masters' Association.

The association has issued the following description of the modern position for the waltz and similar dances. Dancers stand facing opposite directions, half to the side, with lady looking over gentleman's right shoulder, her left foot outside of gentleman's right foot, likewise his left foot outside of her right foot. Gentleman's right hand placed on lady's back, between the waist and shoulder and where reception rooms will be open. A large collection of recent magazines has been secured for the house and writing materials are available for students.

The main reception room has attractive furniture, taken from the two dormitories for women, now vacated. Bright hangings, comfortable chairs, davenport and side tables have been installed. The hostess house is centrally located on one of the main drives of the campus and easily reached from the boys' barracks. A rest room for women relatives and friends is a feature of the house.

A number of committees of Corvallis women have charge of the institution. These include: Furnishing, Mrs. Adolph Ziefle; finance and supplies, Mrs. H. A. Vickers; magazines and books, Mrs. O. J. Wilson; publicity, Mrs. Mary E. Pawcett; room supervision, Mrs. W. E. Lawrence; information on room accommodation, Mrs. T. A. H. Teeter; Red Cross, Mrs. E. L. Potter; committee on volunteer hostesses, Mrs. U. G. Dubach.

For Portlanders and others who motor to Corvallis to visit sons and friends in the student army training corps the hostess house will be headquarters, where information about the town, camp and college will be obtainable and where reception rooms, rest and reading rooms will be open. A large collection of recent magazines has been secured for the house and writing materials are available for students.

NEW HOSTESS HOUSE AT OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE.

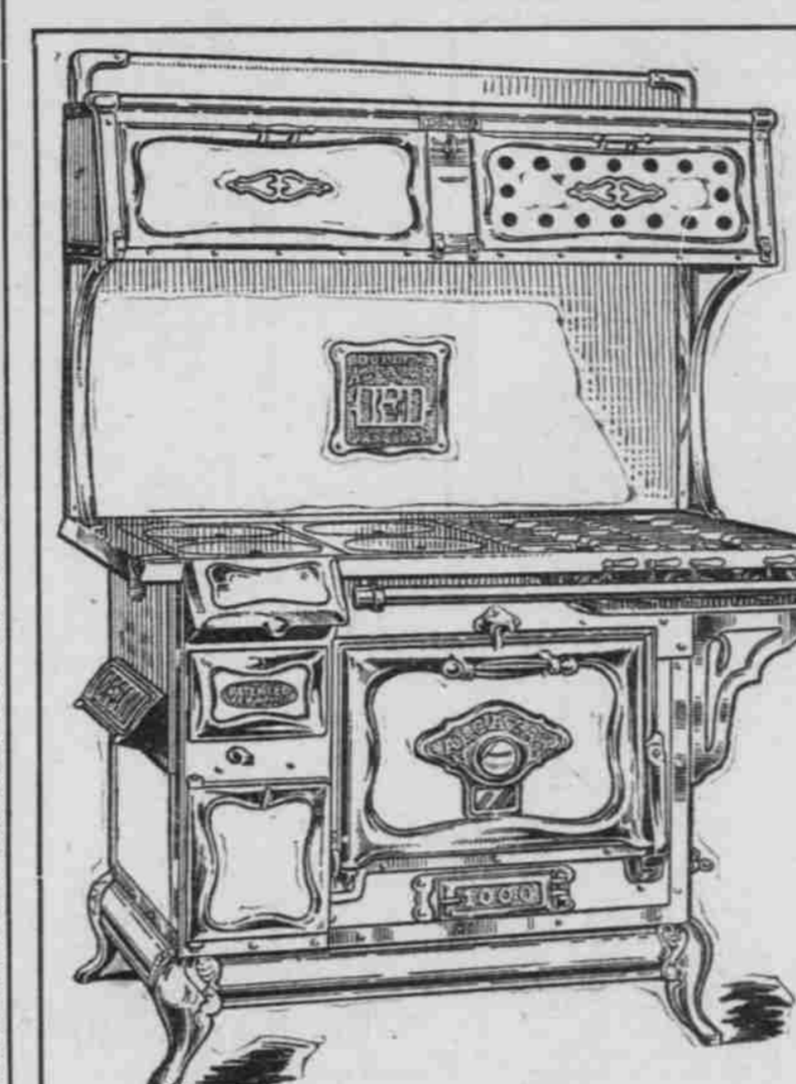

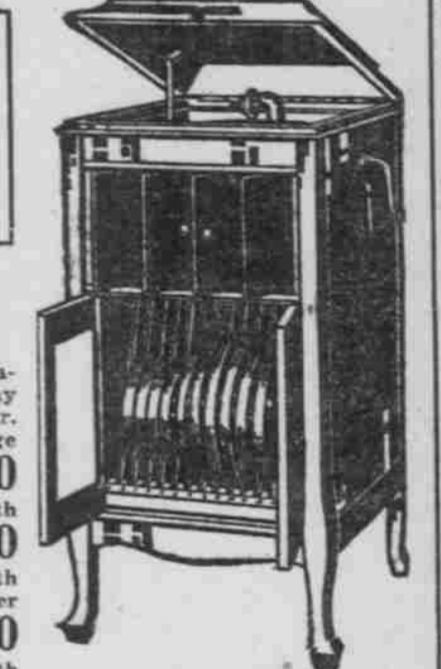
