BANK DEPOSITS SHOW INCREASE.
SALEM, Or., Nov. 23.—(Special).—Deposits in Portland banks on November 1 had increased \$19,588,212 from the preceding statement two months and a half previously, according to a statement by Superintendent of Banks Bennett. The total deposits aggregate \$125,384,709 in the banks of that city and total resources \$127,677,909. The savings deposits reached a total of \$24,876,555, or an increase of \$478,856 since August and \$4,182,323 over a year ago.
