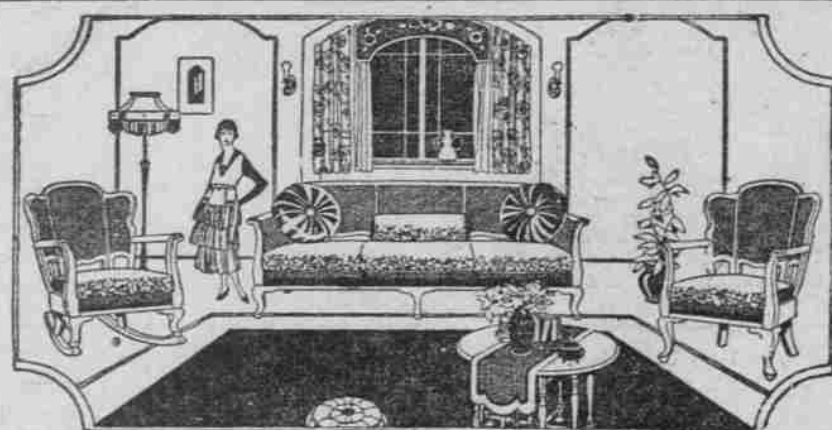

Courageous Young Women Needed in Russia.

THE National Y. W. C. A., with headquarters in New York City, is offering an opportunity to specially trained women desiring to do reconstruction work to go to Russia to join a force of nine secretaries already at work in Archangel, a city behind the allied lines.

The women who will be accepted for this service must be trained to particular lines of work, such as recreation leaders, who are much needed at the present time in that country; cafeteria directors, dietitians, business workers, gymnasium experts and women experienced in handling industrial jobs.

Annual Christmas Exhibition of Art Is Open.

THE fourth annual Christmas exhibition now is open at the Portland Art Museum under the direction of the Art Association. One room of the museum has been set aside for a collection of rare examples of art of Christmas traditions. The room is exquisitely decorated. In one corner is a little group of plaster figures, representing the Christ child in the manger, and Mary and Joseph kneeling in adoration. The figures are the work of the children's art class and are an example of the Flemish "Master of the Legend of St. Ursula," culled from "The Virgin Enthroned and Three Portraits," painted in 1486. Copies of many of the most famous pictures of the Nativity also are on exhibition. The museum will be closed on Christmas day, but will be open all other days. Y. W. C. A. War Committee Reviews Year's Work.

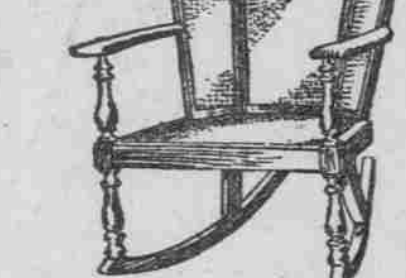
