

Smith, who called for ad-vice when a petition with 70 names was presented to him for inaugurating the state fish hatchery near Roy, with the loss of 1,200,000 salmon eggs, State Fish Commissioner L. H. Darwin reported today. Other state hatcheries were also badly damaged by high waters, he said.


