

PATTISON IS INDICTED ON CHARGE OF FRAUD

Lumberman Accused of Counterfeiting Bills of Lading.

18 TRUE BILLS RETURNED

Charge of Spreading Propaganda for Birth Prevention Faced by Albany Man.

Indictments on 12 counts of J. A. Pattison, head of the lumber company which bears his name, on charges of counterfeiting bills of lading...

Mr. Pattison, who is out under bonds of \$10,000, was arrested by federal officers six weeks ago on charges of fraud in getting bills of lading...

In a statement issued yesterday by officers of the Portland office, it is asserted that the bank does not hold a dollar of Pattison's obligations.
